



NOTES

The aim of this publication is to provide users with a range of the latest statistics available at the end of each month of issue. Consequently the dates and periods shown are not always the same for each table but are in each case the latest figures available at that time.

As a general rule footnotes do not appear in this publication.

Seasonal adjustment

Seasonal adjustment is a means of removing the estimated effects of normal seasonal variations from economic time series so the the effects of other influences are obvious. Seasonal variations are the systematic (though not necessarily regular) intra-year movements of economic time series. These are often the result of non-economic phenomena, such as climatic changes, and regular religious festivals e.g. Christmas and Easter.


SELECTED FEATURES

External Trade

Imports into Victoria decreased from \$2,101 million in November 1994 to \$1,891 in December 1994, a decrease of 10.0 per cent. Imports in December 1994 increased by 15.8 per cent over imports in December 1993.

Exports (excluding re-exports) from Victoria increased from \$1,131 million in November 1994 to \$1,136 million in December 1994, an increase of 0.4 per cent. Victorian exports increased by 5.8 per cent in December 1994 when compared with December 1993.

Consumer Price Index

The consumer price index for Melbourne increased by 0.8 per cent between September and December quarters 1994.

The weighted average of the eight capital cities also increased by 0.8 per cent between September and December quarters 1994.

(Change from previous quarter)


