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AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY BUSINESS INDICATORS, FEBRUARY 1994

MAIN FEATURES

In the February edition of ACT Business Indicators, increases have been noted in the following series:

- Secured commitments for the purchase of new dwellings for the ACT in December showed an increase of 4.8 per cent from the month before, and an annual rise of 42.3 per cent to \$17.5 million.
- The number of industrial disputes per thousand employees in December for the ACT has risen to 76.0. This compares with last year's figure of 20.0 disputes per thousand employees.
- The ACT's trend series number of unemployed in January increased by 9.3 per cent from the same period last year.
- The January 1994 labour force original series, the number of unemployed persons for the ACT has risen from the previous month by 23.2 per cent to 15 400.
- In the January labour force original series, the ACT unemployment rate has risen by 23.9 percentage points from the previous month, and 12.8 percentage points from the year before.
- For December 1993, the price index of house building materials increased from the same period last year by 5.7 per cent, and from the previous month by 0.1 per cent, to 150.4.


Some indicators in this February issue have shown a decrease from the previous period or from the year before. Such series include:


- December's secured commitments for the construction of dwellings for the ACT declined by
 5 per cent from the November figure.
- The number of working days lost in November showed a decline from the previous month for ACT and for Australia, decreasing by 100 per cent for the ACT, and 49.6 per cent for the Australian figure.
- For the ACT, the trend series number of unemployed in January decreased by 0.8 percentage points from the December figure.
- In the January original labour force series, the participation rate for the ACT dropped by 1.2 percentage points from the previous month. It also fell from the previous year's figure by 0.4 percentage points.
- For both original and trend series hotels, liquor stores and licenced clubs in the ACT, the December figures showed a decrease from the previous month. For the original series, the decrease was 3.9 per cent to \$12.4 million, and the trend series decreased by 3.4 percent to \$11.5 million.









PRICE INDEX OF MATERIALS USED IN HOUSE BUILDING

LABOUR FORCE Trend unemployment rates


