## Analysis of Table 1.1

In the December quarter 1995, Western Australia's population grew by 6,900 persons to 1,747,000. This is equivalent to an annual rate of population growth of 1.59%.

In the twelve months to 31 December 1995, the population grew from 1,714,400 to 1,747,000, an increase of 32,600 or 1.90%.

At 31 December 1995, there were 877,100 males and 869,900 females resident in Western Australia, a difference of 7,200 more males. Twelve months prior, there was a difference of 7,800 more males. The trend indicates a narrowing in the gap between the sexes.

**Analysis of Table 1.2**


In the December quarter 1995 the total increase in population was 6,900. This was 1,400 or 17% less than the increase in the previous quarter and 1,600 or 30% more than the December quarter 1994. Between September and December 1995 quarters, both net estimated overseas and interstate migration fell substantially.

The increase in population for the calendar year 1995 exceeded the increase of 1994 by 5,700 or 21%. The most significant increase was in the category of net estimated overseas migration which increased by 5,400 or 67%.

**Analysis of Table 1.3**

The number of marriages in the December quarter 1995 was more than double the number in the previous quarter. This repeated the trend of the previous year.

The number of live births dropped by 265 from September quarter and the number of deaths fell by 386. The numbers of live births and deaths were similar to those for the same quarter of the previous year.

The number of divorces increased slightly in the December quarter 1995 (up 137).

**Analysis of Table 1.4**

The marriage rate for the December quarter 1995 was more than double the rate for the previous quarter, repeating the trend of 1994.

The birth and death rates dropped slightly in the December quarter 1995, as they did in 1994.

The divorce rate for the December quarter 1995 rose slightly from the preceding quarter, and was slightly higher than the rate for the December quarter 1994.

## 2.1 OVERSEAS ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES BY MONTH

### Analysis of Table 2.1

Total arrivals in May 1996 were down by 24% from the previous month and up by 6% from May 1995.

The number of permanent arrivals continued to fall for the fourth consecutive month from the peak of January 1996.

Arrivals of short-term visitors and Australian residents increased from May 1995 by 4% and 10% respectively. Long-term overseas visitors were identical to May 1995 whilst long-term resident arrivals dropped by 4%.

Short-term visitor arrivals recorded a large fall of 9,720 persons or 30% from April 1996.

Total departures in May 1996 decreased by 6% from the previous month, but were 12% higher than in May 1995.

Departures of overseas short-term visitors fell by 5,640 persons or 17% compared to the previous month.

## Analysis of Table 2.2

## 2.2 SHORT TERM OVERSEAS ARRIVALS FROM SELECTED COUNTRIES<sup>1</sup>

The total of 22,550 short-term overseas arrivals in May 1996 was an increase of 910 persons or 4% over May 1995.

However, the fall in May 1996 from April 1996 reflected a similar pattern a year ago.

The largest fall occurred in the number of arrivals from the United Kingdom and Ireland which declined by 3,830 persons or 64% from April 1996 and by 660 persons or 23% from May 1995.

All other listed countries recorded falls in arrivals from April 1996 with Japan falling by 1,140 persons or 46% and by 390 persons or 23% from May 1995.

## **2.3 SHORT TERM OVERSEAS VISITOR ARRIVALS BY AIR FROM SELECTED COUNTRIES: PURPOSE OF JOURNEY: HOLIDAY**

There were 13,580 short-term overseas visitor arrivals for holiday in May 1996; a fall of 3,560 persons or 21% from April 1996. This was an increase of 660 persons or 5% on May 1995.

There were large falls in arrivals from the United Kingdom and Ireland which dropped by 850 persons or 51% and Thailand which fell by 830 persons or 51% from the preceding month. The falls for these two countries reflect similar falls in May 1995.

Other falls occurred in New Zealand which dropped by 57%, Japan 43% and Indonesia and Singapore by 4% compared to April 1996.

The number of holidaymakers increased by 15% from Malaysia and by 88% from the United States of America compared to April 1996.

**Analysis of Table 2.4**

The total of 25,720 short-term resident departures for May 1996 was 9% higher than April 1996, and 21% higher than May 1995.

There was a large rise of 2,320 persons or 70% departing to the United Kingdom and Ireland in May 1996 from the previous month. The total of 5,650 persons departing to that destination in May 1996 was the highest recorded in 15 months.

Short-term resident departures to New Zealand fell by 860 persons or 47% from the previous month and by 480 persons or 33% from May 1995.

Departures to Indonesia dropped by 940 persons or 18% from the previous month whilst departures to Singapore fell by 410 persons or 23%.



**Analysis of Table 2.5**

Total short-term resident departures for holidays overseas increased by 350 persons or 3% compared to April 1996. This also represented a rise of 13% on May 1995.

The largest rise in departures was to the United Kingdom and Ireland which rose by 1,150 persons or 75% from April 1996.

Short-term departures to New Zealand fell by 58%, Thailand 49%, Singapore 34%, Malaysia 25% and Indonesia 9% compared to April 1996.

Compared to May 1995, there was a rise of 130 holidaymakers or 26% to Singapore, 530 holidaymakers or 25% to the United Kingdom and Ireland and 410 holidaymakers or 14% to Indonesia.

There were falls of 420 holidaymakers or 48% to Malaysia, 220 persons or 39% to New Zealand and 40 persons or 5% to the United States of America compared to May 1995.

**Analysis of Table 3.1**

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased 0.6 percentage points to 7.6 per cent in July 1996. The trend estimate of the unemployment rate remained the same at 7.7 per cent.

The seasonally adjusted number of persons unemployed decreased by 4,700 to 69,500, while the number of persons employed increased by 13,800 to 844,400.

Western Australia's seasonally adjusted participation rate for July 1996 increased by 0.5 percentage points to 66.5 per cent and continues to be the highest of all the states.

Trend estimates for January 1995 to June 1996 have been revised.



**Analysis of Table 4.1**

Data in this table have been revised and now show data from the redesigned retail Business Survey. See Information Paper (8511.0) issued on 1 December 1994 or Retail Trade Australia (8501.0) for more detail on the survey redesign.

Estimated turnover of Western Australian retail establishments during June 1996 was \$968 million (at current prices), a decrease of 6.3% over the previous month. The trend estimates show a decrease of 0.4% over the previous month.


From May 1995 to May 1996, trend estimates indicate a national annual growth rate of 4.8%. The annual growth rate for Western Australia for the same period was 5.1%.



**Analysis of Table 5.1**





WESTERN AUSTRALIA**





### IMPORTS BY SELECTED DIVISION







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
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
