## ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES JANUARY 1995

#### MAIN FEATURES

#### **Employment**

Seasonally adjusted, the estimated number of employed people in NSW in December 1994 was 2,704,300, an increase of 0.9% from November 1994 and an annual increase of 3.7% to December 1994. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of employed people increased by 0.5% from November 1994 to December 1994 and by 3.6% over the twelve month period to December 1994.

### Unemployment

The seasonally adjusted estimate of the number of unemployed people in NSW in December 1994 was 261,900. This was slightly higher than the figure for November 1994 and 40,200 less than December 1993. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in NSW for December 1994 remained at 8.8%. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate declined to 8.9% in December 1994.

### **Building Approvals**

The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW in November 1994 fell by 17.9% from the previous month. This is the third consecutive month that new dwelling approvals have fallen in NSW.

#### **Tourism**

Tourist accommodation in NSW continued to experience growth with an 8.9% increase in guest nights between September quarter 1993 and September quarter 1994.

### Finance

Between October 1994 and November 1994 the value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW increased by 20%, significantly greater than the 13.1% national increase. The value of housing finance commitments in NSW in November 1994 was 3.3% lower than in November 1993.

### **NOTES**

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.

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









## PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)









### VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS COMMENCED (Average 1989-90 prices, quarterly)




## UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)




