ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES FEBRUARY 1994

MAIN FEATURES

Employment

Seasonally adjusted, the number of employed persons in NSW in January 1994 increased by 9,000 or 0.3% from December 1993. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of employed persons increased by 22,000 or 0.3%.

Unemployment

The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW in January 1994 was 300,500, a decrease of 8,000 or 2.6% from the previous month. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons declined by 0.9%. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for NSW decreased from 10.6% in December 1993 to 10.3% in January 1994.

Retail Turnover

The trend estimates of retail turnover for NSW in December 1993 increased by 0.8% on the previous month, marginally higher than the national increase of 0.5%.

New Motor Vehicle Registrations

The seasonally adjusted number of new motor vehicle registrations in NSW for January 1994 increased to 16,857 or by 13.0% from January of the previous year. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of new motor vehicles increased to 48,784 or by 9.0% for the same period.

Building Approvals

The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW in December 1993 decreased by 11.1% from November to 3,556 compared to an increase of 2.4% to 15,243 for Australia.

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.






GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT, AUSTRALIA









PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)




NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)




VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS COMMENCED (Average 1989-90 prices, quarterly)




UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)




RETAIL TURNOVER (Trend, monthly)
