### **ECONOMIC INDICATORS. NEW SOUTH WALES AUGUST 1996**

MAIN FEATURES

**EMPLOYMENT** The seasonally adjusted number of employed persons in NSW was

2,788,100 in July 1996, a decrease of 0.2% on the previous month.

Nationally, employment rose by 0.1% over the same period.

UNEMPLOYMENT The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW was

> 238,500 in July 1996, a rise of 2.6% on the previous month and a rise of 6.1% over the previous year. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate

in July 1996 was 7.9% in NSW and 8.5% nationally.

**NEW MOTOR VEHICLE** 

**REGISTRATIONS** 

Seasonally adjusted, new motor vehicle registrations in NSW increased by 35.2% from 16,586 in May 1996 to 22,427 in June 1996.

**BUILDING APPROVALS** The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW

in June 1996 was 3,321, a decrease of 15.2% on the previous month and

6.9% lower than in June 1995.

**FINANCE** The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW

in June 1996 fell by 10.3% from May 1996 and 4.0% from June 1995.

## NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.






# GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT, AUSTRALIA SEASONALLY ADJUSTED





