ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES OCTOBER 1997

MAIN FEATURES

EMPLOYMENT Employment rose by 1.8% in NSW in September 1997 to a seasonally

adjusted figure of 2,817,400. Nationally, employment rose by 0.9% over

the month.

UNEMPLOYMENT Seasonally adjusted unemployment fell by 0.8% in September 1997 to

239,300. The unemployment rate in NSW was 7.8% in September 1997

compared to the national rate of 8.6%.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE

REGISTRATIONS

In seasonally adjusted terms, new motor vehicle registrations in NSW increased by 0.8% from 19,113 in July 1997 to 19,272 in August 1997.

BUILDING APPROVALS The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW

in August 1997 was 4,862, a rise of 29.9% on the previous month and

39.3% higher than in August 1996.

BUILDING COMMENCEMENTS The number of new dwelling units commenced in-NSW in the June

quarter 1997 was 10,127, a decrease of 9.6% on the previous quarter but

an increase of 2.1% on June quarter 1996.

FINANCE The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW

in August 1997 was \$1,882 million. This represented a 4.4% decrease from

July 1997 but an increase of 9.5% from August 1996.

NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.
