ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES NOVEMBER 1994

MAIN FEATURES

Employment

Seasonally adjusted, the estimated number of employed people in NSW in October 1994 was 2,681,000, a decrease of 0.4% from September 1994. In the twelve months since October 1993 there was an increase of 3.3%. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of employed people decreased by 0.1% between September 1994 and October 1994, but increased by 3.4% over the twelve month period.

Unemployment

The seasonally adjusted estimate of the number of unemployed people in NSW in October 1994 was 259,600, a fail of 15,400 from the previous month and 60,200 from October 1993. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell from 9.3% in September 1994 to 8.8% in October 1994. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped to 9.1% in October 1994.

New Motor Vehicle Registrations

The seasonally adjusted figure for new motor vehicle registrations in NSW firmed with an increase of 10.6% from September 1994 to 20,183 in October 1994.

Building Approvals

The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW in September 1994 fell by 19.0% from the previous month's record high of 6,060. Despite this high percentage fall, the figure for September 1994 is still the second highest figure since August 1988.

Finance

Between August 1994 and September 1994 the value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW fell by 8.3%, slightly more than the 7.2% decrease recorded nationally.

The value of personal finance commitments in September 1994 decreased by 10.1% and was 9.9% lower than in September 1993. The value of commercial finance commitments decreased by 7.0% over August 1994 but was 7.0% higher than in September 1993.

NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.









PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)




NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)




VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS COMMENCED (Average 1989-90 prices, quarterly)




UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)




RETAIL TURNOVER (Trend, monthly)
