


ECONOMIC INDICATORS, VICTORIA, DECEMBER 1993



Unemployment rate

The trend estimate of the unemployment rate in Victoria decreased slightly to 12.5 per cent in November 1993. This followed an increase from 11.6 per cent in March 1993 to 12.6 per cent in October 1993.

At the national level the unemployment rate remained steady at 11.1 per cent following an increase from 10.8 per cent in April 1993.



External trade

Imports into Victoria increased from \$1,692.1 million in September 1993 to \$1,907.3 million in October 1993, an increase of 12.7 per cent. Imports in October 1993 increased by 11.9 per cent over October 1992.

Exports (excluding re-exports) from Victoria increased from \$1,069.1 million in September 1993 to \$1,182 million in October 1993, an increase of 10.6 per cent. Victorian exports increased by 47.1 per cent in October 1993 compared with October 1992.

Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months data become available.






EMPLOYED PERSONS Change over same period previous year November 1993



UNEMPLOYMENT RATE Trend series




INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES Working days lost per '000 emplyees For the twelve months ended September 1993




RETAIL TURNOVER

PRIVATE NEW CAPITAL EXPENDITURE Seasonally adjusted June quarter 1993


