In 1911, an area of 2,368 square kilometres was transferred to the Commonwealth of Australia by the State of New State Wales (NSW) to become the Australian Capital Territory (ACT). The city of Canberra, Australia's national capital, is located in the northern part of this area, 300 km south-west of Sydney and 650 km north-east of Melbourne by road. On 11 May 1989, self-government for the Territory was proclaimed.

The Eastern Standard Time is 10 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time.

Of the six States and two Territories which comprise the Commonwealth of Australia, the ACT has the highest population density but it is the smallest State/Territory in area.
