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## **AUSTRALIAN DEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS MARCH QUARTER 1983**

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#### **MAIN FEATURES**

## Quarter ended March 1983

The estimated resident population of Australia at 31 March 1983 was 15,336,100. The population increased by 60,000 during the quarter, compared with an increase of 68,100 for the corresponding quarter one year earlier.

There were 62,000 births and 25,500 deaths registered during the quarter (compared with 60,600 and 26,100 respectively during the March quarter 1982).

Net estimated overseas migration gain was 23,600 persons compared with 33,600 for the March quarter 1982.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### Introduction

This quarterly publication contains estimated resident populations for Australia and the States and Territories. It also provides the latest available statistics of births, deaths (including infant deaths), marriages, divorces and overseas as well as interstate migration. In addition, the publication includes age estimates of the resident population for 1971, 1976, 1981 and 1982. The December 1982 issue of this publication, released on 19 July 1983, contained a complete historical series of estimated resident populations, from 30 June 1971 to 31 December 1982.

- 2. The estimated resident population is the official population estimates series compiled according to the place of usual residence of the population.
- 3. The figures at the 1981 census date were arrived at by:
  - (a) adjusting the Census Counts (Actual Location basis) to obtain counts on the basis of usual residence (Census Counts, Place of Usual Residence);
  - (b) adjusting the Census Counts, Place of Usual Residence, for census under-enumeration; and
  - (c) adding to the adjusted Census Counts, Place of Usual Residence, the number of Australian residents estimated to have been temporarily overseas at the time of the census.
- 4. An explanation of the 'place of usual residence' conceptual basis for population estimates is given in the ABS Information Paper entitled Population Estimates: An Outline of the New Conceptual Basis of ABS Population Estimates (3216.0), released on 29 March 1982. An ABS technical paper, Methods and Procedures in the Compilation of Estimated Resident Population 1981 and in the Construction of the 1971-81 Time Series (3103.0), was issued on 11 March 1983.

## Related publications

6. Detailed annual demographic statistics appeared for many years in the annual publication *Demography* which ceased after the issue for 1971. Since then, annual statistics have been contained in the publications listed below.

Births, Australia (3301.0). The 1981 issue was released on 6 October 1982; the 1982 issue is expected to be published in September 1983.

Deaths, Australia (3302.0). The 1981 issue was published on 22 October 1982; the 1982 issue is expected to be released in October 1983.

Marriages, Australia (3306.0). The 1982 issue was published on 23 August 1983.

Divorces, Australia (3307.0). The 1982 issue was released on 25 July 1983.

Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia (3404.0). The 1982 issue was published on 2 September 1983.

The 1981 issue, containing final estimates for 1971 to 1976 and preliminary figures for 1977 to 1981, was published on 23 August 1982; the 1982 issue, finalising age distributions from 1977 onwards, was released on 22 July 1983.

## ESTIMATED RESIDENT POPULATION AND COMPONENTS OF POPULATION CHANGE

#### Notes and definitions

Method of estimation. The estimates of the population of Australia and the States and Territories at 30 June 1981 are the adjusted (for under-enumeration) Census Counts, Place of Usual Residence, to which have been added the number of Australian residents estimated to have been temporarily overseas at the time of the census.

Estimates for dates after 30 June 1981 are made by adding to the estimated resident population for the census date components of natural increase (on a usual residence basis) and net overseas migration gain. Quarterly estimates of the Australian population for intercensal periods were obtained by adding to the population at the beginning of each period components of natural increase (usual residence basis) and net overseas migration gain. An additional quarterly adjustment (intercensal discrepancy) was made in order to make each intercensal total increase agree with the difference between the estimated resident populations at two census dates. For the States and Territories, both for intercensal and post-censal estimates, account is also taken of estimated interstate movements involving a change of usual residence.

Natural increase. Excess of births over deaths by State of usual residence.

Net estimated overseas migration. Figures are based on net permanent and long-term overseas movements (see notes and definitions, Overseas Migration section) with State or Territory not stated allocated. Short-term movements are excluded. The estimates from July 1976 onwards include an adjustment for the net effect of 'category jumping'. This adjustment is necessary because net permanent and long-term migration figures can be affected by changes in travel intentions, as when an Australian resident departing for a short-term visit overseas (stating that he intends to stay abroad for less than 12 months) in fact stays more than 12 months, thereby changing his travel category from short-term to long-term. An ABS technical paper, Estimates of Residents Temporarily Overseas, Visitors in Australia and Category Jumping (3104.0), was published on 10 March 1983.

Net estimated interstate migration. Information about internal migration is available from population censuses and from a sample survey of internal movements which has been conducted at more or less annual intervals since 1970. These sources do not provide the up-to-date quarterly estimates of interstate migration required for regular population estimates. Quarterly estimates are derived from records of interstate changes of addresses

advised to the Department of Social Security in connection with family allowance payments. Family allowance transfer data relate to children only, and interstate migration for all ages is based on the expansion of these family allowance data using ratios of adult to child populations. These ratios, calculated for each interstate flow, are based on results from the latest available census. Data from the *Internal Migration Survey* are used to constrain the *total* interstate moves to those revealed by the Survey.

Because of difficulties in obtaining adequate coverage of all movements from family allowance transfers, estimates of interstate migration are less reliable than those relating to overseas migration and natural increase. Data derived from the ratio expansion method are subject to revision in the light of the more accurate census data.

In this publication, estimates for the 1976-81 intercensal period are consistent with data on interstate migration from the 1981 Census. Estimates for July 1981 onwards are based on the ratio expansion method described above.

Rates of population growth. These express a change during a period as a proportion (per cent) of the population at the beginning of the period. These rates should be distinguished from crude rates (of natural increase, net migration, etc.) which are expressed per 1,000 of mean population.

Mean populations. These are calculated for financial and calendar years to the formula:

mean population = 
$$\frac{a + 4b + 2c + 4d + e}{12}$$

where 'a' is the population at the end of the quarter immediately preceding the twelve month period, and 'b', 'c', 'd' and 'e' are the populations at the end of each of the four succeeding quarters. Mean populations are used in the calculation of crude rates. The weights used in the formulation of the mean annual populations have been derived using a mathematical technique which involves the fitting of a third degree polynomial function to a series of points. Further explanation of this procedure is available to interested users on request to the ABS.

Population by age/sex. The age/sex data for the 1976 and 1981 census dates are based on the Census Counts, Place of Usual Residence which subsequently were adjusted for under-enumeration and to which were added estimated numbers of Australian residents temporarily overseas on census night.

## **BIRTHS, DEATHS, MARRIAGES AND DIVORCES**

## Notes and definitions

Occurrence and registration. Births and deaths are registered in the State or Territory of occurrence which is not necessarily the State or Territory of usual or last residence of the mother or the deceased. Births and deaths are shown in the quarter or year of registration.

Live births. A live birth is the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the period of gestation, which after such separation breathes or shows any other evidence of life such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord or definite movement of voluntary muscles.

Crude birth and death rates. The number of live births or deaths per 1,000 mean estimated resident population.

Infant death rate. The number of deaths under one year registered per 1,000 live births registered in the same year.

Marriage. Under the Australian Marriage Act 1961, marriages may be celebrated by a minister of religion registered as an authorised celebrant, by a district registrar or by other persons authorised by the Attorney-General. Notice of the intended marriage must be given to the celebrant at least one calendar month but within 3 calendar months before the marriage. A celebrant must transmit an official certificate of the marriage for registration to a district registrar in the State in which the marriage took place.

Divorces. The term divorce, as used in this publication, refers to decrees of dissolution of marriage. Prior to 1980 the term was used to include nullities of marriage and, where application was made before 5 January 1976, judicial separations granted. Details of nullities of marriage are no longer collected from 1980 onwards.

Crude marriage and divorce rate. This is the number of marriages or divorces per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population. (The usefulness of this rate is limited

because a large and varying proportion of the population used in the denominator is below the minimum age of marriage or is unmarried. Age-specific marriage and divorce rates can be found in the more detailed marriage and divorce publications listed under 'Related publications' at the beginning of this publication).

Total fertility rate. The sum of age-specific fertility rates (live births at each age of mother per 1,000 female population of that age). It represents the number of children a woman would bear during her lifetime if she experienced the rates of the period shown.

Female gross reproduction rate. The sum of female agespecific fertility rates. It represents the average number of daughters born to women all of whom survive to the end of the reproductive period and bear daughters at each age in accordance with the rates prevailing in a year.

Female net reproduction rate. This allows for mortality during the child-bearing period. It represents the average number of daughters born to women who are subject to the fertility rates of a year and the mortality as determined from a life table.

Nuptial births. Live births are identified as nuptial where the father registered was married to the mother at the time of the birth or where the husband died during the pregnancy.

Life expectancy refers to the average number of additional years a person of a given age and sex might expect to live if the age-specific death rates of the given period continued throughout his/her lifetime.

The median age is the age which divides the total numbers in a population into two equal halves.

The median duration of marriage is the duration (in years) which divides the number of marriages dissolved into two halves, one half of these marriages having lasted shorter, the other half longer than the duration shown.

## **OVERSEAS MIGRATION**

## Notes and definitions

Category of overseas movement.

Permanent movement consists of movements of persons who, on arrival, state that they intend to settle in Australia (settlers), including assisted settlers as identified by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs; and former settlers and other Australian residents, who, on departure, state that they do not intend to return to Australia.

Long-term movement consists of movements of visitors arriving and Australian residents departing temporarily with the intention to stay in Australia or abroad for more than twelve months, and the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents who had stayed in Australia or abroad for more than twelve months.

Short-term movement consists of movements of travellers whose intended or actual period of stay in Australia or abroad is less than twelve months.

Travellers who state exactly twelve months or one year as their actual or intended stay are randomly allocated to long-term or short-term in proportion to the number of returning travellers who report their actual length of stay as up to one month more or one month less than a year. Travellers who fail to state their period of stay are allocated to the short-term category.

Method of estimation and reliability of overseas migration statistics. All arriving and departing overseas travellers are required to complete passenger cards which are the source of the statistics. To reduce processing costs, passenger cards in respect of movement by air with a duration of stay of less than one year are sampled. Estimates for these movements are subject to sampling variability and measures of the sampling error are available. The reliability of the statistics is also affected by errors of reporting and, in particular, by discrepancies arising from the fact that certain information reflects the passengers' intentions at the time the cards are completed, and their intentions are of course subject to change.
