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## MAIN FEATURES

*Note* : Net interstate migration estimates for the first three quarters of 1979-80 have been revised; see notes and definitions on page 17. These revisions have also affected the State and Territory population estimates for those quarters.

### QUARTER ENDED JUNE 1980—

The Australian population increased by 48,800 compared with 42,300 for the corresponding quarter one year ago.

There were 57,049 births and 25,801 deaths registered during the quarter. The figures for the June quarter 1979 were 56,792 births and 25,806 deaths.

Net migration gain (permanent and long-term movement) was 17,600, an increase of 6,331 over the figure of 11,269 for the June quarter 1979.

### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 1980—

The Australian population at 30 June 1980 is estimated at 14,615,900.

The increase of 194,000 and the corresponding total rate of population growth of 1.35 per cent over the population one year earlier are the highest since the financial year 1973-74. This total growth rate was made up of natural increase of 0.81 per cent and net migration of 0.53 per cent.

Births during 1979-80 were 223,683 compared with 223,371 for the year 1978-79.

Deaths registered were 106,454, a decrease of 1,861 or 1.7 per cent compared with 1978-79 figures. This continues the reduction in mortality experienced over the past few years.

Net overseas migration (excess of arrivals over departures of persons classified as permanent or long-term) was estimated at 76,800, an increase of 18,498 or 31.7 per cent over the 1978-79 figure. After a low of 21,231 in 1975-76 net migration is again starting to approach the 1973-74 level (82,926).

There were 106,547 marriages registered in 1979-80. This figure is 2,655 higher than that for 1978-79 and 4,309 higher than 1977-78.

## Introduction

This publication provides the latest available statistics of births, deaths (including infant deaths), marriages, divorces, interstate migration, overseas movements and population estimates, for Australia, the States and Territories. It contains references to related and other publications of interest and it is intended to provide information for the general reader. Persons requiring further details should consult the publications listed below or contact the ABS directly.

This publication replaces both of these. Detailed annual demographic statistics appeared for many years in the annual publication *Demography* which ceased after the issue for 1971. Since then, annual statistics have been contained in the publications listed below.

*Deaths, Australia* (3302.0). The 1978 issue was released on 23 June 1980, the 1979 issue is expected to be released in the first half of 1981.

*Marriages, Australia* (3306.0). The 1979 issue was released on 31 October 1980.

*Divorces, Australia* (3307.0). The 1978 issue was published on 2 June 1980, the 1979 issue is expected to appear early in 1981.

8. In this publication population estimates and provisional overseas migration statistics have been rounded to the nearest hundred. Neither rounded figures, nor unrounded figures identified as part estimated, should be assumed to be accurate to the last digit shown.

## POPULATION ESTIMATES

### Notes and definitions

*Method of estimation.* The estimates of the population of Australia, the States and Territories at 30 June 1976 are the Census results adjusted for underenumeration. Estimates for later dates are derived from these by the addition of natural increase and net migration gain (which excludes overseas movement of less than one year). For the States and Territories account is also taken of estimated interstate movements involving a change of usual residence. For dates between June 1971 and June 1976 the estimates were derived retrospectively from the June 1976 estimates.

*Mean populations.* These are calculated for calendar and financial years to the formula:

$$\text{mean population} = \frac{a + 4b + 2c + 4d + e}{12}$$

where *a* is the population at the end of the quarter immediately preceding the twelve month period, and *b*, *c*, *d* and *e* are the populations at the end of each of the four succeeding quarters. Mean populations are used in the calculation of crude rates.

The weights used in the formulation of the mean annual populations have been derived using a mathematical technique which involves the fitting of a third degree polynomial function to a series of points. Further explanation of this procedure is available to interested users on request to the ABS.

*Crude rates.* These are the numbers of births, deaths, etc. per 1,000 mean population. The infant death rate is the number of deaths under one year registered per 1,000 live births registered.

*Rates of population growth.* These express a change during a period as a proportion (per cent) of the population at the beginning of the period. These rates should be distinguished from crude rates (of natural increase, net migration, etc) which are expressed per 1,000 of mean population.

*Provisional estimates.* These refer to or incorporate a provisional net migration component as obtained from counts of passenger cards made by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs. *These figures will be superseded by better based statistics and may be subject to significant revision.*

*Population by age.* The 1976 base figures are the results of the Census of 30 June 1976 adjusted for underenumeration, misstatement of ages and other factors including certain age-specific adjustments in respect of short-term travellers. A detailed explanation appears in *Estimated Age Distribution of the Population: States and Territories of Australia, June 1971 to June 1976* (3201.0).

## BIRTHS AND DEATHS

### Notes and definitions

*Natural increase.* Excess of registered births over registered deaths.

*Occurrence and registration.* Births and deaths are registered in the State or Territory of occurrence which is not necessarily the State or Territory of usual or last residence of the mother or the deceased. Births and deaths are shown in the quarter or year of registration.

*Live births.* A live birth is the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the period of gestation, which after such separation breathes or shows any other evidence of life such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord or definite movement of voluntary muscles.

*Crude birth and death rates.* The number of live births or deaths per 1,000 mean population.

*Infant death rate.* The number of deaths under one year registered per 1,000 live births registered in the same year.

*Total fertility rate.* The sum of age-specific fertility rates (live births at each age of mother per 1,000 female

population of that age). It represents the number of children a woman would bear during her lifetime if she experienced the rates of the period shown.

*Female gross reproduction rate.* The sum of female age specific fertility rates. It represents the average number of daughters born to women all of whom survive to the end of the reproductive period and bear daughters at each age in accordance with the rates prevailing in a year.

*Female net reproduction rate.* This allows for mortality during the child-bearing period. It represents the average number of daughters born to women who are subject to the fertility rates of a year and the mortality as determined from a life table.

*Nuptial births.* Live births are identified as nuptial where the father registered was married to the mother at the time of the birth or where the husband died during the pregnancy.

*Life expectancy* refers to the average number of additional years a person of a given age and sex might expect to live if the age-specific death rates of the given period continued throughout his/her lifetime.

## MARRIAGES AND DIVORCES

### Notes and definitions

*Marriage.* Under the Australian Marriage Act 1961, marriages may be celebrated by a minister of religion registered as an authorised celebrant, by a district registrar or by other persons authorised by the Attorney-General. Notice of the intended marriage must be given to the celebrant at least one calendar month but within 3 calendar months before the marriage. A celebrant must transmit an official certificate of the marriage for registration to a district registrar in the State in which the marriage took place.

*Divorces* refer to decrees of dissolution of marriage made absolute, nullities, and, under the Matrimonial Causes legislation (superseded by the Family Law Act 1975), judicial separations granted. For 1976, the first year of operation of the new legislation, divorces determined under the superseded legislation are shown separately.

*Crude marriage and divorce rate.* This is the number of marriages or divorces per 1,000 of the mean population. (The usefulness of this rate is limited because a large and varying proportion of the population used in the denominator is below the minimum age of marriage or is unmarried. Age-specific marriage and divorce rates can be found in the more detailed marriage and divorce publications listed under 'Related publications' at the beginning of this publication).

*The median age* is the age which divides the total numbers in a population into two equal halves.

*The median duration of marriage* is the duration (in years) which divides the number of marriages dissolved into two halves, one half of these marriages having lasted shorter, the other half longer than the duration shown.

## MIGRATION

### Notes and definitions

#### *Categories of overseas travellers.*

*Permanent movement* consists of persons who, on arrival, state that they intend to settle in Australia (*settlers*), including *assisted settlers* as identified by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs; and Australian residents, including *former settlers*, who, on departure, state that they do not intend to return to Australia.

*Long-term movement* consists of visitors arriving and Australian residents departing temporarily with the intention to stay in Australia or abroad for twelve months or more, and the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents who had stayed in Australia or abroad for twelve months or more.

*Short-term movement* consists of travellers whose intended or actual period of stay in Australia or abroad is less than twelve months.

Travellers who state exactly twelve months or one year as their actual or intended stay are randomly allocated to long-term or short-term in proportion to the number of returning travellers who report their actual length of stay as up to one month more or one month less than a year. A similar procedure is used for those travellers who fail to state their period of stay.

*Net overseas migration.* For the purpose of estimating the population of Australia, the States and Territories, overseas migration is taken as net permanent and long-term movement. The allocation of net overseas migration to States and Territories of residence is part estimated.

*Occupations of overseas travellers.* Previous issues of this publication have contained a table showing occupation groups for settler arrivals and net permanent and long-term overseas movement.

This table, number 22, has now been deleted and replaced with a table showing permanent and long-term arrivals and departures by age and sex for a number of years. It shows the components (i.e. arrivals and departures) of which the left-hand side of table 23 is the net sum.

Detailed information on the occupations of overseas travellers will, however, still be published, on a quarterly basis, in *Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia* (3402.0) and, on an annual basis, in *Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia* (3404.0).

*Method of estimation and reliability of overseas migration statistics.* All arriving and departing overseas travellers are required to complete passenger cards which are the source of the statistics. To reduce processing costs, passenger cards in respect of movement by air with a duration of stay of one year or less are sampled. Estimates for these travellers are subject to sampling variability and measures of the sampling error are available. The reliability of the statistics is also affected by errors of reporting and, in particular, by discrepancies arising from the fact that certain information reflects the passengers' intentions at the time the cards are completed.

*Provisional statistics.* Provisional estimates are produced during an early stage of processing by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs, to provide first indications of the size of the various components of overseas movement. *These figures, to be superseded quickly by better based statistics, may be subject to significant revision.*

*Statistics of interstate migration.* Information about internal migration is available from population censuses and from a sample survey which has been conducted at more or less annual intervals since 1970. These sources do not provide the up-to-date quarterly estimates of interstate migration required for regular population estimates of the States and Territories. From 1966, and retrospectively to 1961, interstate migration estimates for population estimates have been derived from records of interstate changes of address advised to the Department of Social Security in connection with family allowance payments, and to the Electoral Office in connection with the franchise and electoral rolls. The census and survey results were used to interpolate for the population not covered by the two sources. However, an investigation of the methods and the data (for family allowance and electoral roll transfers) used in estimating interstate migration has revealed serious deficiencies which warrant a change to the procedures being used.

For the year 1979-80, therefore, estimates of interstate migration have been derived by a different procedure. The family allowance data has been used to estimate interstate migration of the 0-14 age group, whereas for the 15 years and over the data from the *Internal Migration Survey*, conducted in July 1980, was used. This survey refers to the year ended 30 June 1980 and results from it were published on 22 January 1981, in *Internal Migration, Australia* (3408.0)

Because of large sampling errors inherent in estimating net interstate migration gains from survey data and the difficulties in obtaining adequate coverage of all movements from both electoral roll and family allowance transfers, estimates of interstate migration are less reliable than those relating to overseas migration and natural increase.

While data from electoral roll transfers was not used for 1979-80, research is continuing to develop a method to better utilize quarterly statistics from the electoral roll and family allowance transfers in conjunction with results of the annual internal migration survey.
