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## SUMMARY OF VITAL AND POPULATION STATISTICS SEPTEMBER AND DECEMBER QUARTERS 1975

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### **Population estimates**

1. The estimated population for Australia as a whole takes account of natural increase and net overseas migration since the latest Census. Natural increase represents the excess of live births registered over deaths registered. Net migration represents the excess of recorded overseas arrivals over recorded overseas departures. A minus sign (-) denotes an excess of departures over arrivals.

The estimate of population for each State or 2. Territory represents the population ascertained at the census plus recorded natural increase and net gain from recorded overseas migration. Gains and corresponding losses that result from movements between States and Territories are also taken into account in so far as they are recorded as transfers of State of residence under child endowment procedures or Australian electoral procedures or are indicated in other ways such as the results of any special count. As records of migration by State or Territory are not complete the estimated State and Territory populations so derived may be subject to more substantial revision than the estimated Australian population when the results of the Population Census of June 1976 become available.

3. Holiday, business and other similar short-term movements between States and Territories are not taken into account in the quarterly calculations. However, such movements do affect the estimates in so far as people who were on holiday or other short-term interstate travel at the time of the census are counted in the population of the State or Territory where they spent census night. On the other hand, changes in the populations of States and Territories due to visitors from overseas and Australians travelling overseas are reflected in all estimates.

4. Mean populations are calculated for twelve-month periods to provide a satisfactory average basis for calculations of annual rates requiring allowance for the continuous change in population figures during such periods. The mean population for any year has been calculated by the formula:

Mean population = 
$$\frac{a+4b+2c+4d+e}{12}$$

where a, b, c, d and e, respectively, are the populations at the end of the quarter immediately preceding the year and at the end of each of the four succeeding quarters; e.g., in the case of a calendar year, 31 December of the preceding year, and 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December of the year under consideration. Rates for quarters are equivalent annual rates calculated by multiplying the number of registrations for the quarter by four and dividing by the average of estimated populations at the beginning and end of the quarter (expressed as a rate per 1,000 of the average population).

## Seasonal and other effects on quarterly figures

5. Quarterly figures and rates for marriages, births and deaths reflect seasonal influences and may also be influenced by varying delays in registrations due to administrative and other factors which may affect the month of registration. A variation in rates based on small numbers of events may reflect transitory changes which can average out in variations in rates based on large numbers. Quarterly divorce figures, particularly the numbers of dissolutions granted, are affected by such administrative factors as the occurrence of law vacations and the availability of judges, and by legislative changes.

#### Preliminary figures

6. The population estimates shown in this bulletin are based on final records of births and deaths for all States, except New South Wales for September and December Quarters 1975, for which only minor revisions of the preliminary figures shown are expected. The migration figures shown are final. The figures in this bulletin replace preliminary estimates subject to revision, which are published in advance in a separate bulletin, *Population and Vital Statistics (Preliminary)* (Reference No. 4.16).

NOTE. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables are due to rounding.

(a) Because of the sudden decrease in the population of Darwin, following the devastation caused by cyclone "Tracy" it has been considered necessary to adjust the mean population of the Northern Territory for the calendar year 1974 and financial year 1974-75. As the evacuation of people from Darwin took place during the last week of the quarter a "representative" population was calculated for the December quarter 1974 by deducting 1/13 of the number of evacuees from the estimate of what the population of Northern Territory would have been had the cyclone not occurred. This "representative" population was then combined with the estimated population for the previous quarters of the calendar year, according to the formula shown in paragraph 4 of the explanatory notes. The difference between the "adjusted" mean population and the mean population derived by the usual calculations was then apportioned to the various States on the basis of first destination, for Darwin evacuees, as shown in "Population Estimates and the Effect of Cyclone Tracy, Darwin, January 1975", Reference No. 4.28 issued on 7 March 1975.
