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
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

## **JANUARY 1985**

Permanent and long-term movements

In January 1985 there were 16,440 permanent and long-term arrivals, 7% more than in January 1984 (15,380), and 10,450 permanent and long-term departures, marginally fewer than the 10,500 in January 1984.

## Short-term visitor arrivals and resident departures

In January 1985 there were 82,600 short-term visitor arrivals, an increase of 5% over January 1984, with the largest increases, in absolute numbers, being of visitors from Japan, the Netherlands, New Zealand and the U.S.A.

101,100 short-term resident departures were recorded in January 1985, 12% higher than the 90,100 recorded in January 1984. The largest increase was in the number travelling to New Zealand (10%) and the USA (24%).

## Settler arrivals

5,870 settler arrivals were recorded in January 1985, marginally more than in January 1984 (5,720). This is the sixth consecutive month in which the numbers of settler arrivals exceeded the number in the corresponding month a year ago. Arrivals of settlers born in New Zealand numbered 900 in January 1985, making up 15% of all settler arrivals.

Both settlers born in Europe and settlers born in Asia decreased (7% and 1% respectively) between January 1984 and January 1985. Settlers born in Asia numbered 2,390 in January 1985 (41% of all settlers) including 270 settlers born in Western Asia (Middle East). The number of settlers born in Europe in January 1985 was 1,630 (28% of all settlers), of which 62% were from the UK and Ireland.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### Introduction

This series of publications contains the latest available statistics of overseas arrivals and departures in summary form. The new data in this issue are statistics for January 1985. More detailed statistics are available in the quarterly and annual publications, Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia (3402.0 and 3404.0).

## Scope

2. The statistics in this publication relate to the number of movements rather than the number of travellers (i.e. the multiple movements of individual persons during a given reference period are each counted separately). However, the statistics exclude the movements of operational air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not then engaged on regular voyages.

## **Definitions**

## Category of movement

3. Category of movement is primarily determined by the traveller's selection of his or her own category on the passenger card. This selection is accepted provided it is consistent with other information on the card.

### Permanent movement

4. Permanent movement consists of movement of persons who, on arrival, state that they intend to settle in Australia (settlers) and persons who are Australian residents (including former settlers) departing permanently, i.e. those who on departure state that they do not intend to return to Australia.

## Long-term movement

5. Long-term movement is defined as the arrivals of visitors and the temporary departures by Australian residents with the intention to stay, in Australia or abroad respectively, for twelve months or more, together with the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents who had stayed, in Australia or abroad, for twelve months or more.

#### Short-term movement

6. Movements of travellers whose intended or actual period of stay is less than twelve months are classified as short-term.

## Country of birth or residence

- 7. Statistics on these items have certain limitations. For instance, it is not possible to make a distinction between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland, (for the tables in this publication 'Ireland' refers to 'The Republic of Ireland' plus 'Ireland, undefined') nor to separately identify England, Scotland and Wales. Similarly 'Korea' could refer to North or South Korea and 'Germany' to the Federal Republic or to the Democratic Republic.
- 8. The grouping of countries into regions in Asia is based on United Nations' classification of world regions. Following this classification, the region which includes most 'middle east' countries is included in Asia and is called 'Western Asia (Middle East)'. The Appendix to this publication contains a detailed list of countries included in the various regions of Asia.

#### **Estimation Method**

- 9. Overseas arrival and departure statistics are derived from a combination of full enumeration and sampling. Fully enumerated strata cover all movements by sea regardless of duration of stay, all permanent movements and all movements with a duration of stay of one year or more. All movements by air with a duration of stay of less than one year are sampled and statistics relating to these movements are therefore estimates which may differ from statistics which would have been obtained if details of all these movements had been processed.
- 10. The statistics in this publication have been minded to a level consistent with their general validity. The sums of the components may not add exactly to totals, due to rounding.

#### Corrections and imputations

11. The imprecision due to sampling errors should not be confused with errors arising from imperfections in reporting, which may occur in any data collection,

whether sampled or not. Every effort is made to minimise such errors, both through careful design of the passenger cards and through checks on the information once it is received. During the edit process some items are corrected where they conflict with other known information. Missing replies to certain items such as age and country of birth are also imputed by reference to other related items.

12. Errors of this kind differ from discrepancies arising from the fact that certain information reflects the travellers intentions at the time the cards were completed. These intentions are of course subject to change. The items particularly affected by such discrepancies are the distinction between permanent and temporary movement and in the latter case, length of intended stay, country of intended stay, State of intended residence and reason for journey.

## Related publications

13. Comprehensive definitions and explanations, and detailed data for three and twelve monthly periods, are contained in *Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia* (3402.0 and 3404.0). Some additional unpublished information in various forms can be made available on request.
