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AUSTRALIAN DEMOGRAPHIC REVIEW NO. 150 OVERSEA ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES - JUNE, 1962 (PRELIMINARY)

Monthly figures of oversea arrivals and departures are shown in the tables below. The figures for the latest month are obtained from a preliminary count and are subject to revision. Final figures for this month will be shown in the next issue of these statistics.

"Permanent and Long Term Movement" relates to persons (other than Australian troops) who state they intend to reside for a period "Short Term Movement" relates to persons who of one year or more - in Australia in the case of arrivals and abroad in the case of departures. intend residence for shorter periods, together with Australian troops irrespective of length of intended residence. The dissections of Permanent and Long Term Movement shown in Tables 2-4 are based on the purpose of travel stated by the oversea traveller. These statistics were shown for the first time on this basis in Demographic Review No. 143. Further information regarding the basis of these figures and statistics for earlier periods were also shown in that Review. (Information regarding other aspects of "Permanent Oversea Migration" was shown in Part II of Demographic Review No. 113).
