

MAIN FEATURES


This summary refers to September 1985 only; similar trends were also apparent for August 1985. Briefly, the numbers of permanent (settler) and long-term arrivals, short-term visitor arrivals and short-term resident departures have increased compared with the same month last year, and the numbers of permanent and long-term departures have decreased compared with the same month last year.

Permanent and long-term movements




There were 13,710 permanent and long-term arrivals in September 1985, an increase of 13% over September 1984. Departures on a permanent and long-term basis in September 1985 were 6,170, a decrease of 5% compared with September 1984.

There were 6,930 settler arrivals in September 1985, 8% more than in September 1984 (6,410). This continues the increase in settler arrivals each month since July 1984 compared with the corresponding month of the previous year.



In September 1985 the number of settlers born in Asia was 2,730, a decrease of 13% compared with September 1984 (3,120). Settlers born in Asia were 39% of all settlers in September 1985 compared with 49% in September 1984. Included in settlers born in Asia were 290 settlers born in Western Asia (Middle East) in September 1985. Settlers born in Europe increased 5% to 1,970 in September 1985 compared with September 1984 (1,880). Settlers born in Europe were 28% of all settlers in September 1985 compared with 29% in September 1984. Settlers born in the United Kingdom and Ireland comprised more than half the settlers born in Europe both in September 1984 and September 1985. Settlers born in Oceania (mainly New Zealand) increased markedly, from 660 in September 1984 to 1,240 in September 1985.

Short-term visitor arrivals and resident departures



Short-term visitor arrivals numbered 77,300 in September 1985, an increase of 13% over September 1984 (68,700). The major countries from which visitors came in September 1985 were New Zealand (19,900 or 26% of all short-term visitor arrivals), the USA (13,500 or 18%), the United Kingdom (9,500 or 12%), and Japan (7,400 or 10%). Compared with September 1984, visitors from the USA increased by 41%, from New Zealand by 21% and from Japan by 9%, whilst visitors from the United Kingdom decreased by 8%.

Short-term resident departures numbered 124,200 in September 1985, an increase of 8% compared with September 1984 (114,600). The major destinations were New Zealand (21,100 or 17% of all short-term resident departures), the United Kingdom (19,300 or 16%), Indonesia (10,900 or 9%), the USA (9,600 or 8%) and Hong Kong (8,000 or 6%). Compared with September 1984 resident departures increased by 36% to the United Kingdom by 21% to Indonesia and by 16% to New Zealand but decreased by 14% to the USA and by 7% to Hong Kong.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This series of publications contains the latest available statistics of overseas arrivals and departures in summary form. The new data in this issue are statistics for August and September 1985. More detailed statistics are available in the quarterly and annual publications, Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia (3402.0 and 3404.0), or can be made available, on request, in unpublished form.

Scope

2. The statistics in this publication relate to the number of movements rather than the number of travellers (i.e. the multiple movements of individual persons during a given reference period are each counted separately). However, the statistics exclude the movements of operational air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not then engaged on regular voyages.

Definitions

Category of movement

3. Category of movement is primarily determined by the traveller's selection of his or her own category on the passenger card. This selection is accepted provided it is consistent with other information on the card.

Permanent movement

Permanent movement comprises arrivals of settlers (i.e. persons who hold migrant visas, regardless of stated intended period of stay), New Zealand citizens who indicate an intention to settle and those who are otherwise eligible to settle (e.g. overseas born children of Australian citizens), and permanent departures of Australian residents, including former residents (i.e. those who on departure state they do not intend to return to Australia). This definition of settlers is now indentical to that used by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs. Previously the definition of settlers used by the ABS was the stated intention of the traveller only. Numerically the effect of the change in definition is insignificant, and the change was made to avoid the confusion caused by minor differences between data on settlers published separately by ABS and the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs.

Long-term movement

5. Long-term movement is defined as the arrivals of visitors (except those who hold migrant visas — see paragraph 4 above) and the temporary departures by Australian residents with the intention to stay, in Australia or abroad respectively, for twelve months or more, together with the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents who had stayed, in Australia or abroad, for twelve months or more.

Short-term movement

6. Movements of travellers whose intended or actual period of stay is less than twelve months are classified as short-term, except those who on arrival hold migrant visas (see paragraph 4 above).

Country of birth or residence

- 7. The grouping of countries into regions in Asia in Table 2 is based on United Nations' classification of world regions. Applying this classification, the region which includes most 'middle east' countries is included in Asia and is called 'Western Asia (Middle East)'. The Appendix to this publication contains a detailed list of countries included in the various regions of Asia.
- 8. Statistics on country of birth or residence have certain limitations because of inadequate reporting on passenger cards. For instance, it is not possible to make a distinction between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland, (for the tables in this publication 'Ireland' refers to 'The Republic of Ireland' plus 'Ireland, undefined'), or to separately identify England, Scotland and Wales. Similarly 'Germany' could refer to the Federal Republic or to the Democratic Republic.

Estimation Method

- 9. Overseas arrival and departure statistics are derived from a combination of full enumeration and sampling. Fully enumerated strata cover all movements by sea regardless of duration of stay, all permanent movements and all movements with a duration of stay of one year or more. All movements by air with a duration of stay of less than one year are sampled and statistics relating to these movements are therefore estimates which may differ from statistics which would have been obtained if details of all these movements had been processed.
- 10. The statistics in this publication have been rounded to a level consistent with their general validity. The sums of the components may not add exactly to totals, due to rounding.

Corrections and imputations

- 11. The imprecision due to sampling errors should not be confused with errors arising from imperfections in reporting, which may occur in any data collection, whether sampled or not. Every effort is made to minimise such errors, both through careful design of the passenger cards and through checks on the information once it is received. During the edit process some items are corrected where they conflict with other known information. Missing replies to certain items such as age and country of birth are also imputed by reference to other related items.
- 12. Errors of this kind differ from discrepancies arising from the fact that certain information reflects the travellers intentions, or in the case of settler arrivals the fact that the traveller holds a migrant visa, at the time the cards were completed. These intentions are of course subject to change. The items particularly affected by such discrepancies are the distinction between permanent and temporary movement and in the latter case, length of intended stay, country in which most time will be spent and purpose of journey.

Related publications
