

MAIN FEATURES

Short-term visitor arrivals and resident departures




19% more short-term visitors arrived in December 1985 (150,000) than in December 1984 (125,700), continuing the increase in short-term visitor arrivals since September 1984 compared with the same month last year. Departures of Australian residents (168,100) in December 1985 dropped by 4% compared with December 1984 (174,100), continuing the trend first noted in October 1985. The number of permanent (settler) and long-term arrivals (19,000 in December 1985) continued to increase compared with the same month one year ago (17,560 in December 1984) and the number of permanent and longterm departures (11,130 in December 1985) continued to

decrease compared with the same month one year ago (11,430 in December 1984).

Short-term arrivals of visitors/resident departures by country of residence/country of intended stay


In December 1985 19% of short-term visitor arrivals came from New Zealand, 18% from the U.K. and Ireland, 16% from Canada and the U.S.A. and 9% from Japan. Compared with the same month one year ago, significant increases occurred in visitor arrivals from Canada and the U.S.A. (up 36%), Japan (29%), New Zealand (26%) and the U.K. and Ireland (20%).

SHORT TERM VISITOR ARRIVALS, BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE




26% of short-term resident departures in December 1985 were to New Zealand, 13% to the U.K. and Ireland, 8% to Canada and the U.S.A., 7% to Hong Kong and 6% to Indonesia. Compared with December 1984 the only

significant increase was in resident departures for shortterm to Indonesia (8%), whereas resident departures for short-term to Canada and the U.S.A. dropped by 13% and the U.K. and Ireland by 5%.

Settlers arrivals by area of birth



8,380 settler arrivals were recorded in December 1985, 14% more than in December 1984 (7,350), continuing the increase in settler arrivals since July 1984 compared with the same month one year ago. 3,300 settlers born in Asia arrived in December 1985, 3% fewer than in December 1984 (3,390). Settlers born in Asia comprised 39% of all settler arrivals in December 1985, compared with 46% in December 1984. 2,450 settlers born in Europe arrived in

December 1985, 23% more than in December 1984 (1,990), and they comprised 29% of all settler arrivals compared with 27% in December 1984. Settlers born in the U.K. and Ireland continue to comprise more than half of the settlers born in Europe. Settlers born in Oceania (principally New Zealand) have continued to increase, from 990 in December 1984 to 1,370 in December 1985, and comprised 16% of all settler arrivals in December 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This series of publications contains statistics of overseas arrivals and departures in summary form for the latest available month during which the movement occurred. More detailed statistics can be made available, on request, in unpublished form.

Scope

2. The statistics in this publication relate to the number of movements rather than the number of travellers (i.e. the multiple movements of individual persons during a given reference period are each counted separately). However, the statistics exclude the movements of operational air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not then engaged on regular voyages.

Definitions

Category of movement

3. Category of movement is primarily determined by the traveller's selection of his or her own category on the passenger card. This selection is accepted provided it is consistent with other information on the passenger card.

Permanent movement

Permanent arrivals (settlers) comprises persons who hold migrant visas, regardless of stated intended period of stay, New Zealand citizens who indicate an intention to settle and those who are otherwise eligible to settle (e.g. overseas born children of Australian citizens). This definition of settlers is now indentical to that used by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs. Previously the definition of settlers used by the ABS was the stated intention of the traveller only. Numerically the effect of the change in definition is insignificant, and the change was made to avoid the confusion caused by minor differences between data on settlers published separately by ABS and the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs. Permanent departures are Australian residents, including former settlers, who on departure state they do not intend to return to Australia.

Long-term movement

5. Long-term movement is defined as the arrivals of visitors (except those who hold migrant visas — see paragraph 4 above) and the temporary departures by Australian residents with the intention to stay, in Australia or abroad respectively, for twelve months or more, together with the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents, who had stayed, in Australia or abroad, for twelve months or more.

Short-term movement

6. Movements of travellers whose intended or actual period of stay is less than twelve months are classified as short-term, except those who on arrival hold migrant visas (see paragraph 4 above).

Country of birth or residence

- 7. The grouping of countries into regions in Asia in Table 2 is based on United Nations' classification of world regions. Applying this classification, the region which includes most 'middle east' countries is included in Asia and is called 'Western Asia (Middle East)'. The Appendix to this publication contains a detailed list of countries included in the various regions of Asia.
- 8. Statistics on country of birth or residence have certain limitations because of inadequate reporting on passenger cards. For instance, it is not possible to make a distinction between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland, (for the tables in this publication 'Ireland' refers to 'The Republic of Ireland' plus 'Ireland, undefined'), or to separately identify England, Scotland and Wales. Similarly 'Germany' could refer to the Federal Republic or to the Democratic Republic.

Estimation method

- 9. Overseas arrival and departure statistics are derived from a combination of full enumeration and sampling. All movements by sea regardless of duration of stay, all permanent movements and all movements with a duration of stay of one year or more are fully enumerated and processed. All movements by air with a duration of stay of less than one year are sampled and statistics relating to these movements are therefore estimates which may differ from statistics which would have been obtained if details of all these movements had been processed.
- 10. The statistics in this publication have been rounded to a level consistent with their general validity. The sums of the components may, due to rounding, not add exactly to totals.

Corrections and imputations

- 11. The imprecision due to sampling errors should not be confused with errors arising from imperfections in reporting, which may occur in any data collection, whether sampled or not. Every effort is made to minimise such errors, both through careful design of the passenger cards and through checks on the information once it is received. During the edit process some items are corrected where they conflict with other known information. Missing replies to certain items such as age and country of birth are also imputed by reference to other related items.
- 12. Errors of this kind differ from discrepancies arising from the fact that certain information reflects the travellers intentions, or in the case of settler arrivals the fact that the traveller holds a migrant visa, at the time the passenger cards were completed. These intentions are of course subject to change. Particularly affected are the distinction between permanent and temporary movement and in the latter case, length of intended stay, country in which most time will be spent and purpose of journey.
