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**NATIONAL SCHOOLS STATISTICS COLLECTION,
AUSTRALIA 1984**

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MAIN FEATURES

In July 1984 there were 10,025 schools in Australia of which 7,544 (75.3 per cent) were government schools operated by the State Directors-General of Education (or equivalent) and 2,481 (24.7 per cent) were non-government schools.

The number of full-time students attending these schools totalled 3,017,720 comprising 2,260,551 (74.9 per cent) in government schools and 757,169 (25.1 per cent) in non-government schools.

The number of full-time students attending government schools decreased by 20,471 (0.9 per cent) from the 2,281,022 attending in 1983. (No comparable figure is available for the non-government series due to the change in coverage for that series between 1983 and 1984).

The number of teaching staff at government and non-government schools in July 1984 comprised 181,521 full-time teachers and 24,396 part-time teachers who contributed 11,836 full-time equivalent (FTE) units of effort, giving a total FTE teaching staff of 193,357.

The FTE of teaching staff at government schools increased by 2,652 (1.8 per cent) from the 145,908 staff in 1983. (No comparable figure is available for the non-government series due to the change in coverage for that series between 1983 and 1984).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains statistics of government and non-government schools, students and staff, as at 1 July 1984. It is the first of the National Schools Statistics Collection (NSSC) series to incorporate data for both the government and non-government sectors.

2. The NSSC series was established through the work of the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee, of which the ABS is a member. This committee was established in 1979 by the Australian Education Council to improve the quality of education statistics relating to government and non-government primary and secondary education, and has developed a set of concepts, definitions and classifications for schools, students and staff, for use in the National Schools Statistics Collection.

3. Statistics on government and non-government schools were published in *Schools, Australia* (4202.0) series until 1981. In 1981, 1982 and 1983 government schools data were published in *National Schools Statistics Collection: Government Schools, Australia* (4215.0). The non-government schools data were published in *Schools: Australia* 4202.0 for 1981 and then in *Non-Government Schools, Australia* (4216.0) for 1982 and 1983.

4. The implementation of the 1984 National Schools Statistics Collection, Australia, combines both the government and non-government schools collections. With this implementation, concepts, definitions, classifications and coverage have been revised, therefore care should be taken when comparing data for the non-government sector from this publication and those mentioned above.

Scope and coverage

5. The statistics in this publication relate to establishments which have as their major activity the administration and/or provision of full-time day primary, secondary or special education, or primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence. Major activity is based on the activity of students or where this is not appropriate, on the activity of staff in full-time equivalent units (FTE). See paragraph 24 for details of the calculations of FTE. Those establishments at which some other activity is major are excluded, therefore the statistics presented do not include establishments, students or staff engaged in such activities as the Tertiary Orientation Programs conducted by Technical and Further Education Institutions in Victoria.

Census date

6. The census date for the collection was 1 July 1984 (or as near as possible to that date).

Definitions

7. A *non-special school* must satisfy the following criteria:

- (a) Its major activity is:
 - (i) the provision of full-time day primary or secondary education or,
 - (ii) the provision of primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence;
- (b) It is headed by a principal (or equivalent) responsible for its internal operation; and
- (c) It is possible for students to enrol for a minimum of four continuous weeks, excluding breaks for school vacations.

8. A *special school* is one which provides special instruction for physically and/or mentally handicapped students, or those with social problems. Students must exhibit one or more of the following characteristics before enrolment is allowed:

- (i) mental or physical handicap, slow learning ability;
- (ii) social or emotional problems;
- (iii) in custody, on remand.

9. The term 'school' in this publication includes schools in institutions and hospitals, mission schools and similar establishments. The term excludes pre-schools, kindergarten centres, pre-primary schools or classes in or attached to ordinary schools, senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes, and institutions such as business or coaching colleges.

10. An *Ancillary Education Establishment* (AEE) is an establishment where the major activity is the provision of aspects of primary, secondary or special education to students supplementary to that provided by schools. AEEs include those education establishments in institutions and hospitals where students cannot enrol for a period exceeding four continuous weeks, certain holiday excursion centres, etc.

Note: In this publication AEE data include students and staff only.

11. *Other education establishments* within the scope of these statistics, but not defined as schools or Ancillary Education Establishments, include:

- (a) Administrative offices which have as their major activity the administration of primary, secondary or special education; and
- (b) Teacher resource centres operated by a State Director-General of Education.

12. *Primary education* is that full-time education which typically commences at around age 5 and lasts for seven to eight years. It does not include sessional education such as pre-school education. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, primary education may extend from pre-year 1 to year 6 (or equivalent). In South Australia and Northern Territory it may extend from pre-year 1 to year 7 (or equivalent). In Queensland and Western Australia it may extend from year 1 to year 7 (or equivalent).

13. *Secondary education* is that education which typically commences at around age 12 after completion of primary education and lasts for five or six years. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, secondary education may extend from year 7 to year 12 (or equivalent). In Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Northern Territory it may extend from year 8 to year 12 (or equivalent).

14. *Special education* is that education provided at special schools.

15. There is no Australia-wide standard method of allocating students and classes to a certain year of education (grade). In particular there are differences in the organisation of both special schools and special classes at ordinary schools. Where possible, special students have been allocated to a year of education, otherwise they have been recorded as *ungraded special*.

16. A number of schools (other than special schools) do not maintain a formal grade structure. Students at these schools have been allocated to equivalent grades where possible but otherwise appear against the category *ungraded non-special*.

17. A *student* is a person who is enrolled in a school and active in a course of study other than pre-school or Technical and Further Education (TAFE) courses. Persons absent at the reference date are included if they were expected to be absent for less than four continuous weeks (excluding schools vacations) and are excluded if they had left the school or had been absent without explanation for four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) prior to the reference week.

18. A *full-time student* is one who undertakes a workload specified as full-time in the government or non-government sector.

Note: This publication contains full-time students only.

19. The *apparent retention rate* is the percentage of students commencing secondary school who remain at school until the third last, second last or last year of schooling (i.e. years 10, 11 or 12). The rates are called *apparent* as they do not take into account the effects of migration, the repeating of classes, or inter-system transfer on the school population.

20. *Staff* are persons who are involved in the administration or provision of primary, secondary or special education.

Note that as a rule:

- (a) Full-time equivalents (FTE) for staff are apportioned across areas of activity on the basis of time spent in the various areas of activity.
- (b) The functions (general teaching, etc) of staff are determined on the basis of predominant activity.

21. *Teaching staff* are those staff normally paid under a Teachers Salary Award (or equivalent) and who are in contact with students, i.e. support students either by direct class contact or on an individual basis. They include classroom and general teachers, librarians/teacher librarians, guidance/counselling/careers advisors and relieving teachers but exclude staff who provide professional support to teachers.

Note:

- (a) Public Service Awards are not considered to be equivalent to Teachers Salary Awards;
- (b) Teachers in promotional positions, such as principals and deputy principals, are considered to be teaching staff.

22. *Non-teaching staff* are those who are not in contact with students, or who are not normally paid under a Teachers Salary Award (or equivalent).

23. *Full-time staff* are those who perform the full allocation of duties specified as full-time in the relevant award, contract or administrative arrangement. However, persons who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out-of-scope of the collection (eg. pre-school, TAFE, etc) have been regarded as part-time.

24. *Part-time staff* are staff who are not employed full-time, or who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out-of-scope of this collection (e.g. pre-school, TAFE, etc.)

Note:

- (a) The full-time equivalent of part-time staff performing some out-of-scope activities is calculated on the basis of the proportion of time spent on in-scope activities compared with that spent by a full-time staff member solely occupied by in-scope activities.
- (b) The full-time equivalent of part-time staff performing solely in-scope activities is calculated on the basis of time worked compared with that worked by full-time staff performing similar duties.
- (c) Some states however, are not able to calculate full-time equivalent on a time spent basis for all staff functions but use wages paid as a fraction of full-time rate, or a resource allocation based formula. Some also use a pro-rata formula based on student or teacher numbers to estimate aggregate FTE for some categories of staff.

25. Staff are categorised as school staff or as non-school staff. They are placed in the former category if they usually spend more than half of their time actively engaged in duties at one or more schools or Ancillary Education Establishments.

26. The *area of activity* of staff is considered to be primary education, secondary education and special education. Special education is taken as only referring to activities carried out at special schools.

Methodology

27. These statistics are compiled from collections conducted in co-operation with the Australian Education Council Schools Statistics Committee (AECSSC) by the State/Territory Departments of Education (government series) and the Commonwealth Department of Education (non-government series).

28. (a) The methodologies employed by State Departments of Education in the government sector in compiling the State aggregates on which the statistics in this publication are based vary from State to State. They range from manipulation of central administrative records to direct collection of data from establishments.
- (b) The Commonwealth Department of Education collects data directly from establishments in the non-government sector for all States and Territories. The statistics in this publication are a summary of that collection.

Interpretation of results

29. The following factors should be considered in interpreting the figures in this publication:

- (a) Because of the diversity of the Australian education system and its administration, the statistics reported in this publication are not entirely comparable. Comparability between States and

between government and non-government schools in any one State is affected by differences in the organization of grades, policy on student advancement, flows from secondary to vocational education and the recruitment and employment of teachers.

- (b) Age grade tables — non-government schools. Age by grade figures for non-government schools have not been included in this publication. A detailed analysis of the age/grade data supplied by the Commonwealth Department of Education indicates an increased trend towards older age groupings in each grade across all states. The movement does not appear consistent with previous years data and may be related to changes in collection methodology. Further investigation will be undertaken particularly in relation to the 1985 data. For further information on the age/grade data users should contact the Commonwealth Department of Education.

STRUCTURE OF PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLING

The structure of primary and secondary schooling in Australia varies between the different States and Territories. There are three basic patterns evident, as illustrated below.

In South Australia and Northern Territory the primary system comprises a Reception or Transition grade followed by Years 1 to 7. The secondary system comprises Years 8 to 12.

In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory the primary system comprises a Kindergarten or Preparatory grade followed by Years 1 to 6. The secondary system comprises Years 7 to 12.

In Queensland and Western Australia the primary system comprises Years 1 to 7 and the secondary system Years 8 to 12.

Each State and Territory also has a pre-school sector which is separate from primary and secondary schooling. Data on pre-school education within schools have been excluded from primary enrolments in this publication.
