EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin contains statistics of hospitals throughout Australia for the year ended 30th June, 1963, with comparative figures for earlier years. Corresponding particulars appeared in Social Statistics No. 2 - 1960, No. 7 - 1961, and No. 14 - 1962. More detailed information on hospitals in 1961-62 and earlier years is contained in the Official Year Book of the Commonwealth of Australia, No.50, 1964, pages 700-706.

- 2. The particulars shown herein refer to public hospitals and nursing homes (referred to as "public hospitals" in previous issues of this bulletin), mental hospitals, private hospitals and nursing homes (previously referred to as "private hospitals"), and repatriation hospitals.
- The statistics shown under the heading "Public Hospitals and Nursing Homes" refer to institutions providing hospital and nursing home treatment, whether general or special, with the exception of mental hospitals, private hospitals and nursing homes, repatriation hospitals and leper hospitals. They include institutions wholly provided for by the State, partially subsidized by the State or by State endowments but receiving also private aid, and hospitals established and endowed by individuals for the treatment of the sick generally. "Public Hospitals" are premises of this kind in which patients are received and lodged exclusively for "hospital" treatment, i.e. nursing care for the purpose of professional attention. "Public Nursing Homes" are such premises in which patients are received and lodged exclusively for the purpose of nursing home care, i.e., of a kind ordinarily provided in a benevolent home, convalescent home, home for aged persons or rest home for patients requiring professional attention. Note that the statistics shown under this heading agree in scope with those classified as "Public Hospitals" in previous issues of this bulletin.
- 4. Mental Hospitals in addition to the mental hospitals operating directly under the Lunacy and Mental Health Acts of the various States, the statistics shown herein include other institutions providing accommodation and treatment of patients who are legally certified as requiring treatment for mental disorders. The statistics also include the number of voluntary patients in these institutions. Particulars of reception houses, observation wards in gaols, psychiatric clinics and intellectual deficiency training centres are excluded.
- Statistics shown under the heading "Private Hospitals and Nursing Homes" refer to private institutions approved for payment of Commonwealth Hospital Benefits. As in the case of public hospitals and nursing homes these institutions consist of private hospitals and private nursing homes as defined above. The 1963 figures are entirely comparable with private "hospital" figures shown in previous bulletins. Statistics of staff are not available.
- 6. Statistics of repatriation hospitals were not included in the tables in earlier issues of this bulletin. They refer to the nine auxiliary, in addition to the six general, repatriation hospitals.
- 7. As in the past, the tables exclude the four isolation hospitals for the care and treatment of persons suffering from Hansen's disease (leprosy). These are located at Little Bay, N.S.W.; Fantome Island, Queensland; Derby, W.A.; and East Arm Settlement, N.T.. At the end of 1963, there were 329 patients at these hospitals.

Note that Commonwealth benefit is not payable in respect of patients entitled to accident and workers' compensation, nor in respect of patients at these institutions who do not receive hospital treatment or nursing home care.
 - (e) Patients at repatriation institutions. Repatriation patients are also treated at other hospitals at Repatriation expense. The numbers of such patients treated in public hospitals were: 1959, 1,963; 1960, 4,605; 1961, 7,849; 1962, 10,421; and 1963, 12,101. The numbers of repatriation patients resident in Australian mental hospitals at 30th June were: 1959, 1,080; 1960, 1,038; 1961, 1,067; 1962, 1,120; and 1963, 1,111.
