

SECTION 1: ALL COURTS

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Charges

In all courts in Western Australia in 1991-92 there were 123,465 charges heard resulting in 120,938 convictions against 41,672 individuals; 70.2 per cent of charges were dealt with in Courts of Petty Sessions; 24.6 per cent in Children's Courts; and 5.2 per cent in Higher Courts. In Higher Courts 89.3 per cent of charges resulted in convictions compared to 97.9 per cent in Courts of Petty Sessions. Data for Children's Courts only include outcomes of guilty, and consequently the number of charges equals the number of convictions.

Males accounted for 81.8 per cent of charges, 81.8 per cent of convictions and 81.4 per cent of individuals convicted. The mean number of convictions per individual convicted was 2.9 for both males and females.

Convictions

There were 3 offence groups which accounted for 79.9 per cent of all convictions. They were breaking, entering and fraud with 42,342 convictions or 35.0 per cent of all convictions, motor vehicle and traffic offences with 27,260 convictions or 22.5 per cent and offences against good order with 26,987 convictions or 22.3 per cent of all convictions.

Penalties

The total number of penalties imposed was 147,774, including 25,306 occasions where 2 or more penalties were imposed for a conviction. The most frequent penalty imposed was a fine, accounting for 44.5 per cent of all penalties, followed by imprisonment with 12.2 per cent and loss or suspension of drivers licence with 11.4 per cent of all penalties.

Aboriginal people

At the 1991 population census Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people made up 2.6 per cent of the State's population. In 1991-92 Aboriginal people accounted for 24.7 per cent of convictions and 16.9 per cent of individuals convicted. As indicated in Section 1, Table 5, the rate of conviction for persons up to the 30 to 39 year age group is higher than for other age groups. The Aboriginal population has a younger age profile than the rest of the population and to some extent this is a contributing factor to the higher levels of Aboriginal convictions. Aboriginal males accounted for 80.2 per cent of all Aboriginal convictions and 73.9 per cent of Aboriginal individuals convicted. The mean number of convictions per convicted individual was 4.6 for males compared to 3.2 for females. For non Aboriginal people the mean number of convictions per convicted individual was the same for both males and females at 2.6 convictions per individual.

Age distinct persons

The number of distinct persons convicted in all courts was 57,822 with people under the age of 20 years being the group with the largest number of distinct persons convicted, followed by distinct persons in the 20 to 24 years age group. There were 18,032 distinct persons under the age of 20 years convicted accounting for 31.2 per cent of all distinct persons convicted. Within this age group 18 year olds were the main offenders with 5,123 distinct persons convicted. Distinct persons in the 20 to 24 year age group accounted for 24.6 per cent of distinct persons convicted.

Age convictions

Table 8 shows that for most crimes the main offenders were persons in the age groups under 20 years, and 20 to 24 years. Persons aged under 20 years recorded 82.5 per cent of all convictions for theft or illegal use of a motor vehicle and 74.3 per cent of all convictions for breaking and entering.

Persons aged 20 to 24 years recorded more convictions than any other age group for possession and/or use of cannabis (35.5%), armed robbery (33.9%) and assault occasioning actual bodily harm (25.0%).

Persons aged over 30 recorded 76.7 per cent of all convictions for sexual offences (consent proscribed) and 70.3 per cent of all convictions for sexual assault according to state or territory law.

Locality

The distribution of convictions between the Perth Statistical Division and the rest of the State varied depending on the offence. The Perth Statistical Division recorded 95.2 per cent of all convictions for armed robbery, 83.9 per cent of convictions for fraud forgery and false pretences, 59.8 per cent of drink driving convictions, and only 40.0 per cent of liquor licensing convictions. The Perth Statistical Division has 72 per cent of the State's population.







SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Charges

In 1991-92 6,407 charges were heard in the Supreme and District courts of Western Australia resulting in 5,720 convictions against 2,083 individuals. Of all charges 5,908 or 92.2 per cent were against males.

Convictions

Breaking and entering, fraud etc (2,950 convictions) accounted for 51.6 per cent of convictions; offences against the person (1,637 convictions) accounted for 28.6 per cent of convictions and drug offences (422 convictions) accounted for 7.4 per cent. Within the group breaking and entering, fraud etc, breaking and entering was the most common offence class with 1,792 convictions, followed by fraud, forgery and false pretences with 558 convictions.

The majority of convictions (92.7%) were against males. For males under the age of 40, 57.1 per cent of convictions were in the *breaking and entering, fraud etc* group. For males aged 40 and over the main offence group was offences against the person (68.4%).

Age

The age group with the largest number of convictions was the 20 to 24 year age group which recorded 1,496 convictions or 26.2 per cent of all convictions. For the 20 to 24 year group the majority of convictions (64.9%) were for breaking entering and fraud followed by offences against the person (12.4%) and offences against good order (10.4%).

Penalties

The total number of penalties imposed in Higher Courts was 6,775 including 923 convictions which attracted 2 or more penalties. In Higher Courts the penalty most often imposed was imprisonment. Of all penalties imposed 56.0 per cent were imprisonment, followed by probation with 18.3 per cent and community service orders with 13.5 per cent. For offences against the person 75.0 per cent of convictions resulted in the penalty of imprisonment and for breaking, entering and fraud 65.6 per cent of convictions resulted in the penalty of imprisonment. Within the group offences against the person there were 7 convictions for murder and 6 convictions for attempted murder, and each of these resulted in imprisonment.


Aboriginal people

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people accounted for 14.1 per cent of charges and 14.4 per cent of convictions in Higher Courts.

Locality

Of all charges for Higher Courts 5,286 or 82.5 per cent were heard in Perth. Bunbury courts heard 268 charges (4.2%), Kalgoorlie 220 charges (3.4%) and Geraldton 197 charges (3.1%).

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Convictions

In Western Australia in 1991-92 there were 86,660 charges heard against 33,849 individuals in Courts of Petty Sessions. There were 84,820 convictions against 33,476 individuals. Males accounted for 79.3 per cent of convictions and 80.8 per cent of individuals convicted.

The largest number of convictions (18,256) for males occurred in the motor vehicle and traffic offences group. This group accounted for 27.2 per cent of male convictions followed by offences against good order, 25.7 per cent and breaking and entering fraud etc 24.0 per cent.

The largest number of convictions (8,633) for females occurred in the *breaking and entering, fraud etc* group. This group accounted for 49.3 percent of female convictions followed by *offences against good order*, 21.6 per cent and *motor vehicle and traffic offences* 14.4 per cent.

Age

The 20 to 24 year group recorded 25,348 convictions - the largest number of convictions for any age group. This age group comprised 9.0 per cent of the State's population at the 1991 census and recorded 29.9 per cent of all convictions during 1991-92. Of the 20,436 convictions for this age group recorded for males 5,687 were for motor vehicle and traffic offences 5,208 were offences against good order and 4,416 were breaking and entering, fraud etc. For females in the same age group there was a total of 4,912 convictions, 2,221 convictions were for breaking and entering, fraud etc, 1,082 were for offences against good order and 792 were motor vehicle and traffic offences.

Aboriginal people


Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people accounted for 16.2 per cent of individuals convicted and 21.5 per cent of total convictions. Aboriginal males accounted for 20.9 per cent of all male convictions, and 14.6 per cent of male individuals convicted. Aboriginal females accounted for 23.8 per cent of all female convictions, and 23.2 per cent of female individuals convicted. Of the 18,197 convictions recorded against Aboriginal people 77.1 per cent were against males. At the 1991 population census Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people made up 2.6 per cent of the State's population.


Perth

The Perth Statistical Division with 72 per cent of the State's population accounted for 62 per cent of all individuals charged. Outside of Perth the busiest courts were Kalgoorlie which dealt with 3,439 charges against 1,414 individuals and Geraldton which dealt with 2,116 charges against 769 individuals.

Penalties

There was a total of 108,986 penalties imposed in Courts of Petty Sessions in 1991-92. There were 22,790 convictions which attracted 2 or more penalties. Fines were the most common penalty handed down. There were 60,124 fines representing 55.2 per cent of all penalties. Loss or suspension of a driving licence represented 14.5 per cent (15,839) of all penalties and imprisonment 8.4 per cent (9,105). The majority of prison sentences, 5,205 (57.2%) resulted from convictions for breaking and entering, fraud etc.



SECTION 4: CHILDREN'S COURTS

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Convictions

In the Children's Courts in 1991-92 there were 30,398 convictions recorded against 6,113 individuals. Males accounted for 26,380 convictions or 86.8 per cent of all convictions. Of the individuals convicted 5,023 or 82.2 per cent were male.

The largest number of convictions (12,663) for males occurred in the breaking and entering, fraud etc group. This group accounted for 48.0 percent of male convictions followed by motor vehicle and traffic offences, 21.3 per cent and offences against good order 16.8 per cent.

The largest number of convictions (1,947) for females occurred in the breaking and entering fraud, etc group. This group accounted for 48.5 percent of female convictions followed by offences against good order, 25.1 per cent and motor vehicle and traffic offences 14.3 per cent.

Aboriginal people

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people accounted for 35.5 per cent of all convictions in the Children's Courts compared to 21.5 per cent in Courts of Petty Sessions. Aboriginal males accounted for 34.7 per cent of all male convictions, and 18.5 per cent of male individuals convicted. Aboriginal females accounted for 40.8 per cent of all female convictions, and 26.9 per cent of female individuals convicted. Of the 10,793 convictions recorded against Aboriginal people 84.8 per cent were against males.

Perth

Perth Statistical Division recorded 21,511 convictions or 70.8 per cent of all convictions in the State. Outside of Perth the busiest courts were Kalgoorlie with 5.3 per cent of all convictions and Bunbury with 2.2 per cent.

Offences against the person

In 1991-92 there were 1,061 convictions for offences against the person. There were 11 murder convictions, 1 conviction of driving causing death, 896 assault convictions and 137 convictions for sexual offences.


No convictions were recorded against children under 10. There were 31 convictions against 10 year olds with the number of convictions increasing with age and peaking with 17 year olds who accounted for 9,093 convictions or 29.9 per cent of all convictions.

Penalties

Age

There was a total of 32,013 penalties imposed in Children's Courts in 1991-92. There were 1,593 convictions which attracted 2 or more penalties. The penalties most often imposed were probation (16.5%), fines (16.1%) and detention (16.0%).





EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

The statistics contained in this publication relate to indictments finalised in the Supreme and District Courts of Western Australia during the twelve months ended 30 June 1992, and to complaints finalised in the Courts of Petty Sessions and Children's Courts of Western Australia, during the twelve months ended 30 June 1992.

2. It should be noted that a computerised collection and coding system was introduced for the processing of data for this edition. As a result, the ANCO code of each offence was automatically derived solely from the Act details which the offence contravened. This is in contrast to the statistics for previous years, where the ANCO code allocated to each offence was determined from the written description of that offence. Care should therefore be exercised when comparing the offence classifications for 1991-92 with those of previous years.

Higher Courts

- 3. The Supreme Court of Western Australia is constituted under the Supreme Court Act 1935 and exercises an original jurisdiction in both civil and criminal cases. It has exclusive jurisdiction in regard to certain cases, including serious indictable offences such as murder and treason.
- 4. The District Court of Western Australia, constituted under the District Court Act 1969, is a court between the Supreme Court and the Courts of Petty Sessions.

Courts of Petty Sessions

- 5. Established under the Justices Act 1902. In Western Australia, Courts of Petty Sessions deal with:
- (a) charges of simple offences against adult persons, e.g. traffic offences, disorderly behaviour
- (b) indictable offences triable summarily e.g. assault and theft
- (c) preliminary proceedings relating to indictable offences which are not triable summarily, or on which the defendant has an election and chooses to be dealt with on indictment, and
- (d) matters of an administrative and licensing nature.

Children's Courts

6. For the purposes of this publication Children's Courts are those Courts established to hear and determine complaints of offences alleged to have been committed by persons under the age of eighteen years. A Children's Court may also exercise the powers of a Court of Petty Sessions under the Criminal Code, where a complaint of assaulting a child under the age of sixteen years is brought against a person who, at the time of the alleged offence, was of, or over the age of eighteen years.

7. Administration of the Children's Court was transferred from the Department of Corrective Services to the Crown Law Department on 1 December 1989, following the proclamation of the Children's Court of Western Australia Act. As a result of the proclamation of this Act a number of changes have occurred which will affect both the scope and coverage of Children's Court statistics.

Scope

8. Included in the collection are complaints and indictments for which proceedings were commenced before or after 1 July 1991 and finalised during 1991-92.

9. Excluded are:

- (a) complaints and indictments for which proceedings were commenced and not finalised in 1991-92,
- (b) matters relating to the administration of criminal cases formerly dealt with by the court, e.g. conversion of fines to a community service order.
- (c) matters where the only outcome during 1991-92 was the issue of a bench warrant.
- (d) matters dealt with by the Children's Panel.

Classification of Offences

- 10. Offences are classified according to the Australian National Classification of Offences (ANCO). This classification replaces the Druft National Classification of Offences (DANCO), and represents a break in series of Western Australian Court Statistics from 1 July 1987.
- 11. In the ANCO, acts of attempting, conspiring or inciting others to commit a crime, aiding in the commission of a crime, or participating as an accessory before the fact to a crime, are classified to the offence group to which the crime itself belongs. Separate groups are provided, however, for Attempted murder and Conspiracy to murder. Accessory after the fact is classified to Division 5 as an offence against good order.
- 12. The charge of rape was not used from 1 April 1986 following the Acts Amendment (Sexual Assaults) Act No 74 of 1985. The charge is now Aggravated sexual assault.

Penalties

13. The total number of penalties imposed may exceed the total number of charges for which convictions were recorded. This is because, once proven, an offence may attract more than one penalty.

Undercounting of Aboriginal Persons

14. Statistics relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are no more than indicators of the incidence of charges involving Aboriginal persons. Many source documents do not state whether the person charged was Aboriginal or non-Aboriginal. The system of identification is based on observation by the person preparing records used for statistical compiling rather than through a process of self identification.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Appearance. For the purposes of this publication, an Appearance is an appearance by an accused person in court, during which at least one complaint against that person is finalised.

Complaint. A complaint is a written charge preferred against a person in order to initiate court proceedings.

Complaint finalised. For statistical purposes a complaint is regarded as finalised when it is removed, with or without a court hearing, from the list of complaints awaiting hearing in a Court of Petty Sessions or Children's Court. Finalisation may occur:

- (a) Prior to commencement of the court hearing or trial due to
 - administrative or executive action (e.g. decline to prosecute, charges dropped), or
 - other reasons (e.g. accused died).
- (b) after commencement of court hearing of trial because
 - there is a finding of guilty, and conviction and sentencing takes place, or
 - the defendant is committed to a higher court for sentencing, or
 - no conviction is recorded under certain excumstances, or
 - the matter is an indictable offence and is committed to a higher court for hearing, or
 - the matter is remitted to the Children's (Suspended Proceedings) Panel, or
 - the matter relates to an offence by or against a minor and is remitted to the Children's Court, or
 - · the defendant is unfit to plead, or
 - · the case is not proceeded with, or
 - the matter is not proven and the defendant is acquitted, or
 - other reason (e.g. accused is of unsound mind, accused died).

Conditional Release Order (CRO). Offenders receiving this penalty are required to undertake unpaid work in the community for periods ranging from four to twelve weeks. Work is performed under strict supervision and failure to attend as required results in the penalty reverting to detention.

Detention. For statistical purposes included in the detention category are penalties recorded on source documents as:

- placed in a centre of strict security
- placed in the Longmore, Riverbank or Nyandi institutions.

Distinct persons. The number of distinct persons is compiled by summing one offence (the most serious) for each separate person appearing in court on a particular day. In effect, if an offender were to be involved in one court action early in a year and subsequently in a completely separate action later in the year the count would be two distinct persons.

Indictment. Indictment means a written charge preferred against an accused person in order to action a trial before some court other than justices exercising summary jurisdiction.

Indictable Offence. An indictable offence means an offence, a complaint of which is, unless otherwise expressly stated by the Criminal Code, triable by jury.

Indictment Finalised. For statistical purposes an indictment is regarded as finalised when it is removed, with or without a court hearing, from the list of indictments awaiting hearing in the Supreme or District Courts.

- (a) Finalisation may occur prior to the commencement of a court hearing or trial because of:
 - administrative or executive action (e.g. nolle prosequi, decline to prosecute, charges dropped) or
 - other reason (e.g. accused died).
- (b) Finalisation may occur after commencement of court hearing or trial because:
 - the matter is proven. There is a finding of guilty and sentencing takes place, or
 - the matter is not proven and the defendant is acquitted, or
 - the defendant is committed from a lower court and is sentenced in the higher court, or
 - the defendant is unfit to plead, or the case is not proceeded with, or
 - other reason (e.g. accused is of unsound mind, accused died).

Most serious offence. For statistical purposes the most serious offence is the one attracting the most serious

penalty. In accordance with Australian standards for court statistics, the order of severity of penalties imposed in Western Australia is:

- Imprisonment / Detention juvenile institution
- · Detention in a children's institution
- Conditional Release Order (CRO)
- Community Service Order (CSO)
- Probation

.

· Recognisance (bond)

- Loss or suspension of Motor Driver's Licence (MDL)
- Fine
- Compensation
- · Placed under control or committed to care
- Restitution
- Other order.

Total charges. The number of total charges is compiled by summing the counts of each offence for which a complaint is finalised during the year.
