




DECEMBER QUARTER 1993 — KEY POINTS

TREND ESTIMATES

- The trend estimate of gross domestic product – average (GDP(A)), increased by 0.9% December quarter 1993.
- A growth rate of 0.9% has now been recorded for each of the last five quarters.
- The trend estimate of GDP(A) has increased by 3.7% since the December quarter 1992.
- The trends of all three independent measures of GDP (I, E and P) have grown in each of the last nine quarters.
- The trend in GDP(A) per capita has increased in each of the last nine quarters, after declining for the previous two years.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- Seasonally adjusted GDP(A) increased by 1.7% in December quarter 1993, following growth of 0.3% and 1.3% in September and June quarters respectively.
- GDP(I) increased by 1.0% in the December quarter, while GDP(E) grew by 2.5% and GDP(P) by 1.5%.

REVISIONS THIS
QUARTER


Revisions this quarter include those which have arisen from the incorporation of data from two major periodic benchmark sources. Data from the 1991-92 Retail Census have been incorporated into the goods components of private final consumption expenditure and the constant price estimates of gross product for Retail trade and Restaurants, hotels, etc, resulting in revisions from 1986-87. The Census of Population and Housing, which was conducted in August 1991, provided new benchmark estimates for dwelling rent, gross operating surplus for dwellings owned by persons and the constant price estimates of gross product for Ownership of dwellings. Revisions to these aggregates were made from 1986-87 to the latest quarter. In addition, revisions have been made as a result of incorporating the normal annual data sources which become available at this time each year. The seasonally adjusted income and expenditure series have also been revised following the annual reanalyses of these series. Revised pay-day factors from September quarter 1992, which were derived from a Pay Periodicity Survey conducted in respect of September quarter 1992, were used in the seasonal reanalysis of wages, salaries and supplements.

Estimates of GDP(P) have also been revised for all years as a result of revised base year (1989-90) gross product estimates for most industries. In addition, estimates for recent years have been revised due to the availability of more complete survey data and the introduction of new annual benchmarks. For some industries, such as Retail trade, the effect of introducing new benchmarks has been to increase long term growth rates. The overall effect is that growth in GDP(P) between 1984-85 and 1992-93 has been revised from 22.5% to 25.2%.

CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

Annual estimates, derived from the original series, have been added to three of the long-term tables, namely Tables 57, 76 and 77.

Changes to methods of estimation used for government final consumption are discussed in the Analyses and Comments section on page 10.

FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- The growth of 0.9% in private expenditure reflects growth across a broad range of goods and services. The fall of 0.6% in government expenditure reflects the return of expenditure levels to their longer term path after the unusually high seasonally adjusted Commonwealth expenditure in June quarter 1993.

GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- On-going growth in dwelling construction of 2.4% and a return to modest growth in expenditure on equipment of 0.8%, contributed to the 1.3% increase in private expenditure. The continuing decline in non-dwelling construction expenditures resulted in weak growth in total business investment. The fall of 4.3% in public expenditure is mainly due to a fall in public enterprise expenditure which is most marked in the Commonwealth sector.

INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- Trend constant price stocks continued the buildup evident in the last couple of quarters (up \$564 million in December quarter). Seasonally adjusted private non-farm stocks recorded growth of \$827 million in the December quarter, and made a major contribution to growth in GDP(E). Growth occurred in all industry groups.

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- The 2.2% growth in exports reflects increases in service exports and in a broad range of merchandise exports, with coal and machinery being the strongest contributors.

IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- The main contributors to the growth of 1.3% in imports are machinery, other manufactures and chemicals.

DECEMBER QUARTER 1993

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, FISHING AND HUNTING

- The trend estimate increased by 1.3% in the December quarter 1993. The rise largely reflects strong growth in crop production this season.

MINING

- The trend estimate declined by 1.8%, largely reflecting a fall in oil production in the latter half of 1993.

MANUFACTURING

- An increase of 2.2% (4.4% in seasonally adjusted terms) continued the solid growth of recent periods. Strong growth occurred in most sectors. Manufacturing has grown by 8.2% since December quarter 1992.

CONSTRUCTION

- Construction fell 1.2%, following a fall of 0.5% in the September quarter. Continued growth in dwelling construction has been offset by a decline in other construction sectors.

WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- Wholesale and retail trade recorded increases of 2.4% and 1.0%, respectively. In seasonally adjusted terms, Wholesale increased by 1.3% and Retail rose by 2.9%.

TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- A slight increase of 0.3% in the trend estimate contrasts with a 2.2% increase in the seasonally adjusted estimate. Since December quarter 1992 steady growth in Rail, Water and Air transport has been dampened by a decline in Road transport.

COMMUNICATION

- Continued to show steady growth with an increase of 1.8%.


WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Rose by 0.4% (0.3% in seasonally adjusted terms).
- The rise reflects an increase of 0.7% in the number of wage and salary earners and a fall of 0.3% in the underlying average earnings. The corresponding changes in seasonally adjusted terms were an increase of 1.2% in the number of wage and salary earners and a decline of 0.9% in the underlying average earnings.

GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS


- GOS of private corporate trading enterprises grew by 4.0% (5.0% in seasonally adjusted terms) to a level 15.3% higher than in December quarter 1992.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and all the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. The result is that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series - Monitoring "Trends"; An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in March quarter 1994.



Seasonally adjusted growth of 0.8% is required in March quarter 1994 to maintain the trend growth of 0.9% currently estimated for December quarter 1993.

GROWTH RATES IN GDP(A)


The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.



HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the December quarter was 95.9%. The balance, *household saving*, was 4.1%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can be quite marked, even causing changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio, derived from trend data, from December quarter 1979 onwards (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).

TREND**



PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trend current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$544 million (0.9%) during December quarter 1993, while sales increased by \$633 million (1.0%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio fell marginally from 0.891 to 0.890. The following graph presents the ratio of trend private non-farm stocks to trend sales at current prices from December quarter 1979 onward (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).


RATIO OF PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES AT CURRENT PRICES TREND



IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended, at current prices rose to 0.229 in December quarter 1993 from a level of 0.226 in September quarter 1993. Both the trend endogenous imports and trend sales rose. The following graph presents this ratio from December quarter 1979 onwards.

**PRIVATE GROSS FIXED
CAPITAL EXPENDITURE —
NON-DWELLING CONSTRUC-
TION AND EQUIPMENT**

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. There is a particularly large effect from this source in December quarter 1992 which has had a large impact on the growth recorded from December quarter 1992 to December quarter 1993. (See the December quarter 1992 issue of this publication for details.) Details of transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors are provided in the table below, along with investment on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction.

WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

Estimates of wages, salaries and supplements have been substantially affected by increased superannuation contributions by employers as a result of the introduction of the Superannuation Guarantee Levy. From 1992-93, small employers were required to make superannuation contributions on behalf of their employees at the rate of 3% per annum. Large employers (ie those with pay-rolls above \$ 1 million) were required to increase their contributions from 3% to 4% on 1 July 1992 and to 5% on 1 January 1993. Employers were given until 15 August 1993 to make the additional superannuation payments for 1992-93. However, if the payments were made on or before 30 June 1993 they were tax deductible for the 1992-93 financial year. Thus there was a bunching of employer superannuation payments in the June and September quarters 1993. The movements in wages, salaries and supplements, excluding the additional superannuation payments, would have been 0.7, 0.1 and 0.8 per cent in June, September and December quarters 1993, compared with the published figures of 2.0, -0.2 and 0.3 per cent respectively.

GOVERNMENT FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

The method of seasonally adjusting current price Commonwealth government final consumption expenditure was modified to specifically allow for the effect of the number of Commonwealth Public Service pay-days in each quarter.

The method used for deriving constant price estimates of State and local government final consumption expenditure has been changed for Victoria and Tasmania. Redundancy payments are now deducted from the current price values prior to deflation, and a constant price estimate of the redundancy payment liability is added to the result. The constant price estimates of the redundancy payment liability for Victoria and Tasmania are derived by multiplying an employment estimate for the particular quarter by the redundancy payments made in the base year (1989-90) divided by the average employment in 1989-90.

While these estimates of redundancy payment liabilities are not entirely satisfactory, the new method has the desirable effect of removing the volatility caused by redundancy payments from the constant price estimates for these two States. It is hoped to apply the new method to the expenditures of other governments in the future.

TERMS OF TRADE


In December quarter 1993, the trend terms of trade (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) declined 0.1%, reflecting the rise of 0.5% in the IPD of exports of goods and services being offset by the 0.6% rise in the IPD of imports of goods and services.

The 0.2% increase in the seasonally adjusted terms of trade for the December quarter reflects the 0.5% fall in the IPD for exports of goods and services being more than offset by a larger fall of 0.7% in the IPD for imports of goods and services.

The following graph shows the trend terms of trade (1989-90 = 100) from December quarter 1979 to December quarter 1993.


**TERMS OF TRADE (1989-90 = 100)

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below shows trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income from December quarter 1979 onwards. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 75 and 76 respectively.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains estimates of the components of GDP and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, page 12, shows the full range of data provided.

CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

2 These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). In association with the introduction of constant price estimates at average 1989-90 prices, some of the methods used to derive constant price estimates were changed. The major changes are described in Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0).

ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

3 Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

REVISIONS

4 Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

TREND ESTIMATES

5 Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the ABS considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

6 A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters have changed.

7 If a series has a high "irregular" component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this

does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

8 For more information about ABS procedures for deriving trend estimates and an analysis of the advantages of using them over alternative techniques for monitoring trends, refer to the three ABS Information Papers:

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFULATOR (IPD)

9 The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates. Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT : GENERAL METHOD

10 Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here :

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I)

INCOME APPROACH

11 **GDP(I)** is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(E)

EXPENDITURE APPROACH

12 GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989-90 prices.

GDP(P)

PRODUCTION APPROACH

13 GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989-90 prices) for each industry.

GDP(A)

THE AVERAGE

14 While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH

15 Tables 6 to 9 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I) and GDP(P). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100.0$$

where

$A(t)$ = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

$A(t-1)$ = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

$GDP(t-1)$ = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

16 There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used :

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100.0$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 13, 14, 22, 23, 75 and 76.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

17 GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion of

this issue.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 75 and 76.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT
OF LABOUR INPUT

18 Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economics of scale, etc.).

19 When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

20 A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market* sectors are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM
MARKET SECTORS

21 The estimates of gross product at constant prices for two industries: Finance, property and business services; and Community services are derived using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purposes of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price gross product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be GDP(P) less the above two industries, less Public administration and defence (which is defined to be in the non-market sector, even though an estimate of productivity change is now produced for that industry), less ownership of dwellings (for which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), plus the imputed bank service charge related to these industries.

EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND HOURS WORKED

22 A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector less Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of Agricultural production caused by changing seasonal conditions.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

23 The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

24 The ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as :

- private final consumption expenditure on goods
- plus private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment
- plus public gross fixed capital expenditure
- plus exports of non-rural goods.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

25 The ratio is endogenous imports (imports of goods excluding fuel, certain large items of equipment and certain other government imports) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76.

GDP(A) PER CAPITA

26 This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 31 and 32 and is also shown in Table 74.

DATA ON FLOPPY DISK

27 This is the ratio of CDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.

28 All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, *Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0). These data generally run from December quarter 1959. An important exception is CDP(P) and its components which run from December quarter 1974.
