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CONSUMER PRICE INDEX - MARCH QUARTER 1977

Variations in retail prices as measured by the Consumer Price Index for the six, State capital cities and Canberra are shown herein.

- 2. Compared with the previous quarter, the All Groups Consumer Price Index for March quarter 1977 increased by 2.3% for the weighted average of the six State capital cities. Changes in the All Groups index for individual cities were: Sydney +2.1%, Melbourne +2.6%, Brisbane +2.2%, Adelaide +2.1%, Perth +2.3%, Hobart +1.9%, Canberra +1.6%. An analysis of these changes is given in the table on page 4 and in paragraph 15.
- 3. Recent quarterly changes in the All Groups index are shown below. Paragraph 6 on page 2 contains corresponding details for All Groups excluding hospital and medical services (six capitals).

6. In recent quarters the All Groups index has included the effects of unusual changes in prices for the hospital and medical services components of the index. This occurred for September and December quarters of 1975 following the introduction of Medibank, and for December Quarter 1976 following changes to Medibank. In order to facilitate analysis of trends in retail prices excluding these unusual changes a special grouping "All Groups excluding hospital and medical services" has been published in each bulletin since September quarter 1975. The table below compares movements in this measure with those in the All Groups index.

The Consumer Price Index measures quarterly variations in prices of goods and services as affecting a high proportion of the expenditure of employee households in the aggregate. Changes in the pattern of this expenditure since 1950 have been such as to render it necessary to construct the index with additional items and changes in weighting patterns at intervals (rather than on the basis of a list of items and set of weights which remained unchanged throughout the period). Nine series for short periods have therefore been constructed and linked to form a continuous retail price index series published herein as the Consumer Price Index. In each period between links the items and weighting have remained unchanged. A detailed description of the Consumer Price Index up to the link of December quarter 1973 is contained in Labour Report No. 58, 1973. (Reference No. 6.7). Section X11 of the Appendix to this report describes the seventh series. The eighth series differs from the seventh only because of the deletion of the item "radio and television licences" as from September quarter 1974. The Appendix to the bulletin for December quarter 1976 describes the ninth series. A consolidated description of the Consumer Price Index will be prepared and published later.

- 8. The quarterly prices for food items used in the index are the averages of prices normally collected as at the middle of each of the three months of the quarter. Prices for all fresh fruit and fresh vegetables since January 1977 have been collected at weekly intervals and averaged to arrive at monthly prices. Prices of all non-food items are collected at regular quarterly intervals (or at annual intervals with items such as local government rates and seasonal clothing) normally as at the middle of the mid-month of each quarter. However, for furniture, major household appliances and motoring items (other than motor vehicles) the collection is made during the first month of each quarter to facilitate field collection arrangements.
- 9. The indexes measure price movements in each city individually. They do not provide a comparison of the retail price level in any city with the retail price level of any other city.
- 10. Table 1 on page 6 of this Bulletin shows Consumer Price Index numbers for each fiscal year from 1966-67 to 1975-76 and for each quarter from September quarter 1968. Table 2 on pages 7, 8 and 9 shows group index numbers quarterly from March quarter 1974 to March quarter 1977.
- 11. Information on monthly food price movements is contained in the monthly bulletins Consumer Price Index, Food Group Index Numbers (Reference No. 9.11). Since the food group is the only group of the index for which prices are collected monthly, it is not possible to provide monthly indexes for other groups.
- 12. Table 3 on page 10 shows index numbers for December quarter 1976 and March quarter 1977 for groups and sub-groups of the index and for some special groupings. It also contains information of contributions by index sub-groups to the total index in terms of All Groups Index Points for these two quarters. Users of these figures should bear in mind that the Consumer Price Index is designed to measure the proportionate change in retail prices as combined in the eight major groups and more particularly the total of the groups.
- Movements of the indexes from one date to another are usually expressed as percentage changes rather than changes in the 'index points' because 'index point' changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percentage changes are not. In this bulletin details are given in terms of percentage changes in paragraphs 2-6. However, the analysis in paragraph 14 shows movements in terms of All Groups 'index points'. This analysis shows the contribution of selected items and of the eight groups to movements in the total indexes. Table 3 on page 10 shows movements expressed as both percentage changes and changes in 'index points'. The following example illustrates the computation of 'index point' and percentage changes:

15. A summary of the various group indexes, together with the *main quarterly* price changes which affected the index between the pricing dates (see paragraph 8) for December quarter 1976 and March quarter 1977 is shown below:

Food Group. The main increases were for meals out, take-away foods; poultry; fish; cereal products; coffee; and for milk in Melbourne. Fresh fruit and vegetable prices decreased in all cities except Brisbane and Perth. The group index increased by 1.9%.

Clothing Group. Increased prices for men's and boys' clothing and for footwear accounted for most of the increase in this group. The group index increased by 1.5%.

Housing Group. There were increases in all sections of the group except local government rates and charges. The group index increased by 2.2%.

Household Equipment and Operation Group. There were increases in most sections of this group. Electricity charges increased in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Adelaide. Furniture and floor coverings increased in price in all cities except Brisbane. Drapery and household utensil prices increased in all cities. The group index increased by 3.1%.

Transportation Group. Increased private transportation costs were responsible for all of the increase in this group. Motor vehicle and petrol prices increased in all cities. Motor vehicle registration charges increased in Sydney and Melbourne. Third party insurance also increased in Sydney. The group index increased by 2.9%.

Tobacco and Alcohol Group. The group showed a small increase of 0.5%.

Health and Personal Care Group. Increased charges for personal care products and hair dressing were responsible for two-thirds of the increase in this group. The group index increased by 2.0%.

Recreation Group. Higher prices for radio and television equipment and repairs, books, sporting equipment, toys and entertainment admission were responsible for most of the increase in this group. The group index increased by 4.1%.
