AVERAGE RETAIL PRICES OF SELECTED ITEMS EIGHT CAPITAL CITIES DECEMBER QUARTER 1996

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Change in methodology

1. There has been a change in the method used to produce these estimates - see paragraph 5 below.

Scope of publication

- 2. This publication contains average prices for selected items which are included in the Consumer Price Index for the eight capital cities.
- 3. The selected items for which average prices are shown in this publication fall within the Food Group and the following non-food subgroups: household supplies and services: private motoring; alcoholic drinks; and personal care products. The items and varieties selected, however, do not comprise all of the items and varieties which are incorporated in the Food Group or the specified subgroups of the CPI.

Average prices

- 4. Prices shown are the averages of prices for specified grades, qualities, brands, etc. charged by a number of selected retailers in each city. The specified grades etc. and the retailers have been selected as representative to measure price change over time. Thus the prices do not purport to be the actual averages of all retail sales of these items. They should be regarded as no more than approximate indicators of price levels and price changes for the items concerned. Furthermore, the selected grades, brands, etc. for some items differ between cities and may also differ from one period to the next due to a change in product specification. Thus the average prices for some items may not be comparable from city to city, nor from quarter to quarter. Details of differences in specifications are provided in footnotes to the table.
- 5. Commencing with this issue, average retail prices are calculated as the geometric mean of the individual observations. Geometric means have been adopted to reduce the distorting effects of unrepresentative price increases, and are generally lower than arithmetic means. Evaluation of the September quarter estimates shows that for most items the difference due to changing the calculation method is small. The main exceptions to this are some items within the fresh fruit and vegetables and meat categories. September quarter data calculated with geometric means are available on request.

6. Prices for fresh fruit and vegetables are collected weekly and averaged to obtain quarterly prices. Prices for fresh meat, bread, fish, petrol and alcohol are collected monthly and averaged to obtain quarterly prices. Prices for fresh milk are collected at the end of the quarter together with details of price changes during the quarter, and average prices calculated for the quarter. Prices for all other items are collected during the mid month of each quarter (i.e. in August, November, February and May).
