MAIN FEATURES

The following table summarises movements in livestock slaughterings, in original terms (seasonally adjusted figures are not available for these series).

The trend estimate for total red meat production continued to decrease, having reached a peak in June 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms production of red meat rose 0.7 per cent compared with October 1993. In original terms production rose 4.6 per cent in November 1993. Rises occurred in beef and mutton, while falls occurred in veal, lamb and pigmeat.


The number of live sheep exported in September 1993 fell 17.1 per cent compared with August 1993 and 9.3 per cent compared with September 1992. The unit value fell marginally when compared with August 1993 and as a result gross value fell 17.2 per cent to \$10.4 million.

The trend estimate for chicken meat production shows only a slight fall since the peak in July 1993. In original terms, chicken meat production in November 1993 fell 3.0 per cent compared with October 1993.


The trend estimate for whole milk intake by factories may have reached a turning point following decreases since April 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms whole milk intake fell 2.8 per cent in October 1993 compared with September 1993. In original terms there was an increase of 20.0 per cent.

The trend estimate for receivals of taxable wool by brokers and dealers for November showed an increase for the second consecutive month, reversing the downward trend which commenced in March 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms, receivals of taxable wool rose 6.5 per cent although in original terms receivals fell 10.1 per cent in November 1993 compared with October 1993. For the five months ended November 1993 receivals have fallen 7.8 per cent compared with the corresponding period of 1992.





EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains information (preliminary where indicated) on livestock slaughterings, meat production, exports of live, fresh, frozen and processed meat and stocks of frozen meat, whole milk intake by factories, market milk sales by factories and receivals of taxable wool by wool brokers and dealers.

2. Commencing with the June 1992 issue of this publication, the timing basis for compilation of merchandise exports statistics has changed. The change involves compiling exports statistics on the basis of goods shipped in any month rather than on the basis of the documentation of goods shipped in that or earlier months. From the June 1992 issue the data from July 1990 has been revised to the new basis.

Livestock slaughterings and meat production

- 3. The statistics on slaughterings and meat production are based on a monthly collection from abattoirs and other major slaughtering establishments and include estimates of animals slaughtered on farms and by country butchers and other small slaughtering establishments.
- 4. Care should be taken when using this information as the figures only relate to slaughterings for human consumption and do not include animals condemned or those killed for boiling down. Also, definitions of livestock categories may differ between States and within States, particularly with regard to calves.
- 5. Poultry slaughtering statistics have been compiled from returns supplied by commercial poultry slaughtering establishments. Producers in the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory and the many very small producers are excluded from the collection; however, the statistics represent a high level of coverage. The Queensland statistics are based on data collected by the Queensland Department of Primary Industries.

Live sheep exports

6. This table contains statistics of the number of live sheep exported, the gross weight, gross value and unit value. It does not include sheep exported for breeding.

Milk

7. Tables 8 and 9 contain statistics collected by the Australian Dairy Corporation (ADC) on whole milk intake and market milk sales by factories.

Wool receivals

8. The statistics in Table 10 show the amount of taxable wool received by brokers and dealers from wool producers. It excludes wool received by brokers on which tax has already been paid by other dealers (private buyers) or brokers.

9. The information shown is on the basis of the State in which the wool has actually been received and does not necessarily reflect the production of wool in that State.

Seasonal adjustment

10. Details of seasonally adjusted figures for meat, milk and wool are shown in Tables 2, 8 and 10 respectively. Information on the methods used in seasonally adjusting these series is available on request.

Trend Estimates

11. A trend estimate is obtained by reducing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. It is calculated for estimates in this publication by applying a 13 term Henderson moving average to the seasonally adjusted series. More detailed information is available in the ABS Information Papers A Guide to Smoothing Time Series — Estimates of Trend (1316.0), and Time Series Decomposition — An Overview (1317.0).
