SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM THE STATISTICIAN

Welcome to the first edition of the *CensusAtSchool* Newsletter. In recent years the ABS has been working with others in the statistical and education communities to work out how to best improve the statistical literacy skills of Australia's school children. Statistical literacy is an essential life skill for the information age we live in today.



Traditionally the ABS has had a program with schools as part of the lead up to each Population

Census. These programs have a number of objectives but include improving awareness of the Census, providing knowledge of the reasons Australia holds a Census every five years, and some details of how a Census is run. The next Australian Population Census will be in August 2006.

CensusAtSchool is aimed at satisfying both these important needs. It

builds on the successful project being run by the Noel Baker Centre in South Australia as well as a similar program run by the Queensland Office of Economic and Statistical Research prior to the 2001 Population Census.

The program provides a unique e-learning opportunity for young Australians enabling them to work with real data about themselves which increases their interest of course. It will involve a website, lesson plans and other support materials to underpin the program. Professional development activities for the teachers will also be an important part of the program.

Your participation will help to develop an educationally sound website and support materials that are classroom ready and focused on the actual needs of teachers.

Project **UPDATE**

Over the past six months the *CensusAtSchool* project team have been working hard to develop and formulate an overall plan for delivering a successful *CensusAtSchool* project.

We have established an overall project schedule consisting of five main project phases:

- 1. Development building the project.
- Release Testing testing of the web site, educational resources, and the software will be carried out with both teachers and students.
- 3. Registration the beginning of the marketing campaign to launch the project to the education community, and encourage teachers to register and participate.
- 4. Data Collection students complete the online Questionnaire and submit their responses to the *CensusAtSchool* database.
- 5. Data Usage data results are released via an online 'Random Sampler' for classroom use with the supporting educational resources.

WHAT IS CensusAtSchool?

CensusAtSchool has been a highly motivating e-learning experience used by many countries to help improve the statistical literacy of young people. Its introduction into Australia will allow students (Years 5-10) to collect real statistical information about themselves for use across the curriculum (Mathematics, SOSE/HISE, Health and Physical Education, English, ICT and more).

CensusAtSchool is a flexible learning tool that can be used as:

- a source of real data relevant to students.
- an engaging e-learning experience for students to learn about statistics and its application.
- a wonderful source of student focused questions for a problem solving approach to learning, e.g. "Am I a typical Year 8 Australian girl".

The CensusAtSchool web site will:

- enable students to complete an online questionnaire that focuses on them and their interests.
- provide students with the ability to take samples of raw data from the population of responses received Australia wide.
- contain information and activity sheets on how to carry out statistical analysis of the data.
- provide examples of how teachers can use CensusAtSchool in their classroom.
- provide an ongoing learning web site for the students with data collections held every two years.

Teachers are in control of how they and their students use the *CensusAtSchool* web site. *CensusAtSchool* is FREE for all students and teachers across Australia.

TEACHERS' FORUM

The project team would like to share the thoughts of teachers and intermediaries on the review activities they have taken part in.

The ABS has met with Government, Catholic and Independent school intermediaries in each state and territory, These intermediaries have been invited to use their existing networks to provide advice and review on the *CensusAtSchool* project during its development. They have all received the concept of the project very warmly - a valuable learning tool.

At the moment, feedback is being sought on the learning strategy to be used when preparing the web site. This is effectively the scoping document and feedback will result in changes. If you would like to review this document please contact Ian Wong.

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
