Since the last quarter the CensusAtSchool project has progressed significantly and special thanks are extended to those who have assisted the Project Team. Strong interest was registered by teachers from across the States and Territories particularly from those who wish to be included in the mailing list.

CensusAtSchool remains a very interesting and exciting venture which the ABS is embarking on with schools. As mentioned previously, CensusAtSchool is based on a similar program developed by the Royal Statistical Society (RSS) Centre for Statistical Education in the United Kingdom, under the guidance of Professor Neville Davies. The UK project has been extremely successful in improving statistical literacy and has successfully extended to South Africa.

Since then, other organisations have adapted the project to suit their local environment, namely Canada, New Zealand, Office of Economic and Statistical Research (OESR) in Queensland and Noel Baker Centre in South Australia. ABS is privileged to use the CensusAtSchool branding for the Australian project, thanks to the RSS.

- Appointment of goVote to develop the CensusAtSchool software;
- Appointment of the Noel Baker Centre to advise on the statistical education soundness of the support materials and to assist with the delivery of workshops and conferences;
- Conduct of the first Reference Group meeting to provide advice to the project team;
- Completion of the first draft of the CensusAtSchool questionnaire following feedback from teachers; and
- Commencement of the web site design.
