SOCIAL STATISTICS : AUSTRALIA<br>NO. 39 : SCHOOL ENROLMENTS, 1965 (PRELIMINARY)

This statement of the numbers of pupils enrolled in government and nongovernment schools in Australia at the schools censuses in August, 1965 will be followed by the usual bulletin "Social Statistics : Schools" which will contain more detailed information for 1965. Figures contained herein are preliminary and are subject to minor amendments in the later bulletin.
2. Table 1 shows the numbers of pupils enrolled in government and nongovernment schools for each State and Territory from 1961 to 1965. Table 2 shows the numbers of pupils in 1965 classified according to grade.
3. The statistics relate to pupils enrolled in schools which provide education according to the primary and secondary school curricula of the State Education Departments, whether provided in government or non-government schools. Pupils in junior technical schools, correspondence schools and in schools in institutional homes, hospitals and similar establishments are included, as are pupils in special schools and classes which cater for children who are physically or mentally handicapped, socially maladjusted, or who are in similar other categories not normally taught in ordinary schools. Pupils in institutions providing only pre-school education, in senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes and institutions such as business colleges and coaching establishments are, as a rule, excluded. However, pupils in Tasmanian pre-schools are included.

Comparisons of total enrolments between States and between government and non-government schools should be made with care, as they are affected by differences in the school systems, especially regarding ages of commencing full-time education, cessation of compulsory education and transfer from secondary to vocational education.
5. The figures by grades in Table 2 are not comparable between States, nor entirely between government and non-government schools in any one State, and this is one reason why the separate tables have not been aggregated into an Australian table. The grading of pupils differs for the various school-systems in Australia, because of the differences in curricula set by Education Departments. In addition, the methods of allocating classes to grades, particularly classes for special pupils, vary from State to State, and there are also differences in the administrative methods of aggregating grades of a more or less similar nature. While the tables have been slightly rearranged from the data provided by the Education Departments and other sources (for instance, separate tables for primary and secondary schools in some States were combined into one table), they represent essentially the system of grading adopted in each different State.
