

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT	Seasonal adjustment is a means of removing the estimated effects of normal seasonal variations from economic time series so that the effects of other influences are obvious. Seasonal variations are the systematic (though not necessarily regular) intra-year movements of economic time series. These are often the result of non-economic phenomena, such as climatic changes and regular religious festivals, e.g. Christmas and Easter.	
TREND ESTIMATE	Smoothing seasonally adjusted series produces a measure of trend by removing the impact of the irregular component of the series. The trend estimates are derived by applying a 13-term Henderson weighted moving average to the respective seasonally adjusted series. Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months' data become available.




UNEMPLOYMENT RATE, Trend—Monthly




CONSUMER PRICE INDEX, Change from previous quarter




NEW DWELLING UNITS APPROVED, Trend — Monthly




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
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
