

It is the third largest of the states and territories after Western Australia and Queensland, yet has the smallest population and population density. The population is relatively young and highly urbanised with a significantly higher proportion of Indigenous people than in other states.

Darwin City has an estimated population of 72,852. It is the commercial and administrative centre of the Territory. Palmerston and Litchfield Shire with populations of 27,185 and 17,358 respectively, make up the total of the capital city area. Alice Springs is the largest regional population centre outside Darwin and is the base for significant tourism activities in the Central Region. Mining, tourism and defence are major contributors to the NT economy.
