

In 1911, an area of approximately 2,360 km² was transferred to the Commonwealth of Australia by the state of New South Wales to become the Australian Capital Territory (ACT). The city of Canberra, Australia's national capital, is located in the northern part of this area, 300 km south-west of Sydney and 650 km north-east of Melbourne by road.

On 11 May 1989, self-government for the Territory was proclaimed. The ACT is the smallest of Australia's six States and two Territories, but has the highest population density and is the only State or Territory without a sea border.

### **CLIMATE OF THE ACT**

(Latitude  $35^{\circ}$   $19^{\circ}$ S, Longitude  $149^{\circ}$   $12^{\circ}$ E, Height above Mean Sea Level 578.4 metres).

The ACT's climate is essentially continental, with hot summers and cold winters. During 2005, the ACT's weather was wetter and warmer than average, with less fog and one less thunderstorm compared with long-term averages.
