### INTRODUCTION OF ACCRAUL ACCOUNTING FOR THE GENERAL GOVERNMENT SECTOR

From September quarter 1999, data for the general government sector are being compiled, as far as possible, on an accrual basis, although data for Tasmania and the Northern Territory State and local government transactions are still on a cash basis. Previously, most general government data were compiled on a cash basis, with accrual adjustments made in only selected cases where supplementary data were available. For those series for which accrual adjustments were not previously made, it is not possible to recompile all previous quarters on a consistent basis. Consequently, there will be uncertainty surrounding the seasonal factors for some of the affected series for the next couple of years. For some aggregates there are minimal effects arising from the change to accrual accounting and the existing seasonal factors will continue to be appropriate. However, for some aggregates the accrual basis involves a significantly different seasonal pattern and it will take some time to establish stable seasonal factors for the periods from September quarter 1999. Revisions to the seasonal factors, and consequently the seasonally adjusted estimates, for these series can be expected as additional data on the new basis become available. It is also likely that the original data for some aggregates will be subject to greater revision than has previously been the case because it will take time for general government accounting systems to fully adjust to the new accrual basis.

Data relating to Queensland State and local government transactions for each of the four quarters of 1999–00, have been partially estimated by the ABS to align with annual statistics published by the Queensland Treasury in their budget papers brought down in July 2000. In addition, data for September quarter 2000 have been estimated by the ABS using budget forecasts and other indicators, due to the unavailability of data from the Queensland Treasury.

### PRIVATE AND PUBLIC GROSS FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

In the September quarter 2000, the South Australian Government sold electrical generation and distribution assets to the private sector. As a result, private gross fixed capital formation on other buildings and structures recorded a high value, while public gross fixed capital formation recorded a consequently low value.

This large irregular transaction is reflected in the seasonally adjusted and original estimates shown in Tables 14 and 25, but it has been excluded from the calculation of the trend estimates shown in Table 4.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

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### CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

**1** Australia's national accounts statistics are compiled in accordance with international standards contained in the *System of National Accounts, 1993* (SNA93). A revised version of *Australian System of National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (Cat. no. 5216.0) is available on the ABS website. Extensive revisions were required to reflect the implementation of SNA93 in the Australian national accounts and other changes to sources and methods which have occurred over recent years. The corresponding printed version of 5216.0 is expected to be available on 21 December 2000. 5216.0 outlines major concepts and definitions, describes sources of data and methods used to derive annual and quarterly estimates for major aggregates at current prices and in chain volume terms, and discusses the accuracy and reliability of the national accounts. In addition, it includes documentation on input-output tables, financial accounts, capital stock, productivity measures, balance sheets, and state accounts. For detailed information about the nature and extent of the conceptual changes introduced with the implementation of SNA93 reference should be made to the following information papers: *Implementation of Revised International Standards in the Australian National Accounts* (Cat. no. 5251.0), *Introduction of Chain Volume Measures in the Australian National Accounts* (Cat. no. 5248.0), and *Upgraded Australian National Accounts, 1998* (Cat. no. 5253.0).

**2** While national estimates are based on the concepts and conventions embodied in SNA93, no such standard is available for sub-national (regional/State) accounts. In the main, the national concepts are applicable to State accounts, but there remain a number of conceptual and measurement issues that either do not apply or are insignificant at the national level. These are discussed in detail in *State Accounts, Australia: Issues and Experimental Estimates*, ABS Occasional Paper 1984/4. While it is possible in some cases to derive quarterly estimates by State using the same data sources as used for the Australian estimates (or to derive the Australian estimates as the sum of the States), it is sometimes necessary to derive dissections of the Australian estimate using a variety of allocators. These allocators vary from being fairly closely related to the aggregate being measured to being only indirectly related. Information on some of the more important conceptual, methodological and data issues relating to quarterly estimates by State is provided below.

### ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

**3** The estimates contained in this Standard Data Service (SDS) generally represent dissections of quarterly estimates published for Australia in *Australian National Accounts: National Income, Expenditure and Product* (Cat. no. 5206.0). Therefore, they will reflect any inaccuracies in those estimates as well as inaccuracies introduced by the particular conceptual, methodological and data problems inherent in the allocation of Australian estimates to States and Territories. As such, the degree of accuracy and reliability will necessarily be lower than that for the counterpart Australian estimates.

**4** Estimates for compensation of employees, household final consumption expenditure and private gross fixed capital formation are based on the results of sample surveys. By their nature, survey results become less accurate as they are disaggregated (for example into States and/or industries). Generally, the ABS surveys used to derive these aggregates are designed to provide accurate estimates at the Australian total level and individual State estimates that are less accurate but still of acceptable quality. However, it should be noted that relative standard errors are generally higher for the smaller States and Territories than they are for the larger States. This may result in greater volatility in the quarterly estimates for the smaller States and two Territories.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

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### ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES *continued*

**5** Estimates of government final consumption expenditure, and general government and public enterprise gross fixed capital formation can be substantially affected by the indicators chosen to apportion the Commonwealth government component to States and Territories. Care is required when interpreting these estimates.

### REVISIONS

**6** Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. Revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals.

### TREND ESTIMATES

**7** Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the ABS considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

**8** A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters has changed.

**9** If a series has a high 'irregular' component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision than would otherwise be the case for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters. However, it is important to note that this does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

**10** For more information about ABS procedures for deriving trend estimates and an analysis of the advantages of using them over alternative techniques for monitoring trends, refer to *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series—Monitoring 'Trends': an Overview* (Cat. no. 1348.0) or contact the Assistant Director, Time Series Analysis on Canberra 02 6252 6345.

**11** Two feature articles which have appeared in the ABS monthly publication *Australian Economic Indicators* (Cat. no. 1350.0) may also be of interest: '*Picking Turning Points in the Economy*' (April 1991), and '*Smarter Data Use*' (March 1992).

### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

**12** Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix 3 of 5216.0. Two important points should be noted here:

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total. However, the method used to derive the chain volume measure does produce this property; and
- Where chain volume measures have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.

### STATE AND TERRITORY VERSUS AUSTRALIAN SERIES

**13** For trend and seasonally adjusted series, the sum of the States and Territories generally does not equal the corresponding estimate for 'total

Australia', nor are the quarter-to-quarter movements identical. On a few occasions, these differences have been significant, particularly for the seasonally adjusted series. This reflects both the shorter span of data available for seasonal analysis at the State level and the fact that seasonal analysis is generally carried out at a more aggregated level than for the 'total Australia' series. The State and Territory trend and seasonally adjusted series are less accurate than the Australian data. However, as the State and Territory time series lengthen, the quarterly movements in the sum of the State estimates should more closely match those in the Australian series.

### HOUSEHOLD FINAL CONSUMPTION AND PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION

**14** State estimates of household final consumption expenditure and private gross fixed capital formation are derived largely from the same sources as used for the Australian estimates, although a higher degree of approximation is required. In the case of household final consumption expenditure, data sources for major components such as household goods, dwelling rent, purchase of motor vehicles, fares, and purchases of gas, electricity and fuel are available quarterly by State.

**15** State and Territory estimates of private gross fixed capital formation in dwellings and other buildings and structures are derived using data from the ABS quarterly surveys of Building Activity and Engineering Construction, while expenditure on machinery and equipment is derived from the quarterly Survey of Private New Capital Expenditure. Ownership transfer costs are derived from data supplied by the various States, ABS surveys of real estate agents and lawyers, and various other data such as the number of real estate property transfers by State and Territory. Essentially, these are the same data sources used to prepare the Australian estimates. State estimates for gross fixed capital formation in livestock are based on data from the ABS Agricultural Census, the Survey of Livestock Slaughterings and Australian Bureau of Agricultural and Resource Economics surveys. State estimates of exploration expenditure are derived from the ABS quarterly Survey of Actual and Expected Private Mineral Exploration. State estimates of musical originals are based on data supplied by the Australian Recording Industry Association. Other categories of intangible assets are estimated by State using a variety of indirect indicators, such as mean population by State and employment by State.

### COMMONWEALTH GOVERNMENT FINAL CONSUMPTION AND GROSS FIXED CAPITAL FORMATION

**16** The treatment of national government final expenditures in regional accounting is rather problematic. National government includes the Commonwealth Government and the universities, with the major allocation difficulties arising from the Commonwealth Government component. Alternative treatments are to attribute final expenditures to the region in which the expenditure was incurred, or to the region in which the beneficiaries reside, or even to consider the Commonwealth government consumer unit as extra-territorial and therefore to exclude it from all regions. For practical reasons the first approach has been adopted in this Standard Data Service, although it still requires extensive use of indirect indicators. An implication is that a large proportion of the consumption of Commonwealth government services is included in state final demand for the Australian Capital Territory. Estimates for Commonwealth government expenditures in the States on both an annual and a quarterly basis therefore have to be treated with considerable caution.

**17** The non-defence component of Commonwealth Government final consumption expenditure is apportioned to States using data on gross earnings from the ABS Survey of Employment and Earnings. Defence salaries and recurrent expenditure are allocated using defence employment by State, while

defence weapons and their delivery platforms are allocated according to population.

**18** For Commonwealth general government gross fixed capital formation, Australian estimates are first subdivided into expenditure on other buildings and structures, and expenditure on machinery and equipment. The Australian level other buildings and structures expenditure component is generally allocated to States and Territories using population by State as an indicator. Expenditure on machinery and equipment is allocated using Commonwealth general government employment by State and Territory.

**19** Various allocators are applied at the individual enterprise level for Commonwealth public enterprise gross fixed capital formation. Direct allocators are used in a few cases where enterprises operated wholly in one State or Territory. For some corporations, State data for construction activity are available by quarter from the ABS Building Activity and Engineering Construction Surveys. Indirect indicators derived from annual estimates are used to allocate gross fixed capital formation by State for the remaining Commonwealth enterprises. For example, purchases of ships and aircraft are allocated using State shares for general freight and passenger activity through ports and airports in each State and Territory.

**20** Separate State details of international exports and imports of goods, in both current prices and chain volume terms, are provided in this publication. Detailed current price estimates of international trade in goods on a recorded trade basis at the two-digit level of the *Standard Industrial Trade Classification, Revision 3* (SITC Rev3) are used to produce chain volume measures of this component. The exports data are on the basis of State of origin, that is, the State in which the final stage of manufacture or production occurs. For most exports this should correspond to the required basis for State allocation, that is, the State of final resident ownership. There is an assumption that the national deflators will usually provide a reasonable measure of change in price at the State level. Revaluation at the two-digit (division) level of SITC Rev3 is a compromise giving a reasonable level of disaggregation by commodity type without increasing the magnitude of the revaluation exercise too significantly. There are a very limited number of cases where more specific deflators are used to replace the national deflator at the SITC Rev3 division level. This occurs in those cases where the composition of a particular division is known to vary between States, and the division includes commodities with price movements which deviate significantly from the divisional average. Mineral and agricultural commodities are likely to be significant in this regard. The State estimates are benchmarked to the national estimates.

**21** The current price exports estimates differ from those published in *International Merchandise Trade, Australia* (Cat. no. 5422.0). Re-exports, which are not published on a State basis in 5422.0, are allocated to the States, by commodity, and included in the State figures in this publication. Those commodities subject to a confidentiality restriction, which are not available by State in 5422.0, are allocated to the States by commodity in proportion to each State's total exports and re-exports and included in the State export figures in this publication.

**22** For imports, a similar approach is adopted to that employed in the derivation of current price and chain volume measures for exports (see paragraph 20 above). The level of revaluation corresponds broadly to the commodity sub-group level of the balance of payments merchandise imports

end-use classification of imports, i.e. two-digit Broad Economic Category by three-digit level of the SITC Rev3. These data are on the basis of the State in which the imports are released from Australian Customs Service control. In most cases this will correspond to the State of initial resident ownership, which is the required basis of State allocation. No information is available on which to base an adjustment for goods released from Customs' control in a State other than that in which their owner resides.
