CHART 1: CAPACITY OF TOURIST ACCOMMODATION ESTABLISHMENTS, MARCH QUARTER EACH YEAR




CHART 2: OCCUPANCY RATES





CHART 3: TAKINGS FROM ACCOMMODATION

At the end of the March quarter 1988, there were 129,624 rooms available in hotels, motels, etc. with facilities, which is an increase of 6.7% compared with the same quarter last year (121,457 rooms).

There were 205,924 sites available in short-term caravan parks at the end of the March quarter 1988. This is a reduction of 3.2% compared with the same quarter in the previous year (212,626 sites) whilst sites available in longterm caravan parks increased by 18.5% from 62,307 sites in March 1987 to 73,831 sites in March 1988.

The room occupancy rate for hotels, motels, etc. with facilities was 56.5% for the March quarter 1988 (compared with 57.4% for the March quarter 1987).

The site occupancy rate for short-term caravan parks for the March quarter 1988 was 30.9% (the same as for March quarter 1987). For long-term caravan parks, the site occupancy rate for the March quarter 1988 was 52.0% (compared with 51.8% for the March quarter 1987).

Takings from accommodation for hotels, motels, etc. with facilities for the March quarter 1988 were \$440 million, which is an increase of 22.1% compared with the same quarter last year (\$361 million). The average length of stay for guests in hotels, motels, etc. with facilities during the March quarter 1988 was 2.0 days.

Accommodation takings for short-term caravan parks for the March quarter 1988 were \$54 million, an increase of 6.5% compared with \$51 million for the March quarter 1987. Accommodation takings for long-term caravan parks for the March quarter 1988 were \$25 million, an increase of 29.5% compared with \$20 million for the March quarter 1987.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains results, for Australia and each State and Territory, of the quarterly surveys of tourist accommodation establishments.

Scope and Coverage

- 2. Up to the June quarter 1986 survey a tourist accommodation establishment was defined, for the purpose of the survey, as an establishment which predominantly provides short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) available to the general public. Commencing with the September Quarter 1986 survey the definition was extended to include all caravan parks (whether predominantly providing short-term or long-term accommodation). This change has been made because predominantly long-term caravan parks also provide a significant number of sites for short-term accommodation.
- 3. Commencing with September quarter 1987, the scope of the tourist accommodation survey has been expanded to include holiday flats, units and houses available to the general public for short-term accommodation. Release of results from this expanded collection will be deferred until the ABS is satisfied with the validity of the data for all States and Territories.
- 4. Tourist accommodation establishments currently included in the survey are:
 - (a) Licensed hotel with facilities. An accommodation establishment which is licensed to operate a public bar, provides a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms, and has breakfast available for guests.
 - (b) Motel, licensed or unlicensed, private hotel or guest house with facilities. An accommodation establishment which provides a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms and has breakfast available for guests but is not licensed to operate a public bar. This category also includes motels that are licensed to serve liquor with meals.
 - (c) Caravan park. An accommodation establishment which provides powered sites for caravans and toilet, shower and laundry facilities for residents. A short-term caravan park is one which is predominantly occupied by short-term residents (i.e. guests staying for less than 2 months). A long-term caravan park is one predominantly occupied by long-term guests (i.e. residents staying for 2 months or more).
 - (d) Holiday flats, units and houses. Flats, units and houses which are available to the general public for short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) and are operated either by owners or managers who have sole letting rights to at least 5 flats, units or houses or by real estate agents for short-term letting, where the majority of such flats, units or houses are self-contained in terms of cooking, bath (or shower) and toilet facilities and do not have breakfast available for guests. (See paragraph 3 above regarding availability of statistics on this category of tourist accommodation establishments.)

Note that data collected and published for each type of establishment include both long term and short term residents at these establishments.

Definitions

- 5. Number of establishments refers to the number of tourist accommodation establishments within the scope of the survey which operated during the survey period. Included are those establishments which operated for any part of the quarter or which closed temporarily for the quarter because of seasonal reasons. Establishments comprising more than one type of accommodation activity referred to in paragraph 3 above (e.g. a motel with attached caravan park) are treated as two separate establishments.
- 6. Guest rooms refers to the maximum number of rooms, units, suites, etc. available for accommodating paying guests at hotels and motels with facilities during the survey period.
- 7. Bed spaces refers to the maximum number of bed spaces (excluding cots) available to accommodate paying guests at hotels and motels with facilities during the survey period. Three-quarter beds are classified as single beds; double beds are counted as two bed spaces.
- 8. Guest arrivals refers to the total number of paying guests counted on the first night they stayed at the accommodation establishment during the survey period.
- 9. Room nights refers to the total number of nights each guest room is occupied by a paying guest during the survey period.
- 10. Guest nights refers to the total number of nights each paying guest stayed during the survey period.
- 11. Room occupancy rate refers to the proportion of guest rooms occupied to the number of guest rooms available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.
- 12. Bed occupancy rate refers to the proportion of bed spaces occupied to the number of bed spaces available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.
- 13. Average length of stay refers to the number of guest nights divided by the number of guest arrivals expressed as a number of days.
- 14. Powered sites refers to the maximum number of sites with provision for connection to electric power supply which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period. Included are powered sites occupied by on-site vans.
- 15. Unpowered sites refers to the maximum number of sites with no provision for connection to electric power supply which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period.
- 16. Cabins, flats, etc. refers to the maximum number of cabins, flats, units and villas which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period.

- 17. Site nights refers to the total number of nights each powered/unpowered site, cabin, flat, etc. is occupied by a paying guest during the survey period.
- 18. Sites occupied by long term residents refers to the total number of sites occupied by long term residents (i.e. guests who have stayed continuously for 2 months or more) at the end of the survey period.
- 19. Site occupancy rate refers to the proportion of site nights to the total caravan park capacity available during the survey period expressed as a percentage. Unoccupied vans are treated as vacant sites.
- 20. Takings from accommodation refers to revenue received from the provision of short term and long term accommodation at tourist accommodation establishments. Takings from meals are excluded. Takings from accommodation for each month represent the takings received during that month. Where payments are received in advance of, or after, the provision of accommodation to guests, the monthly figure for takings from accommodation may not necessarily bear a direct relationship to the number of guests accommodated during the month. Rental and storage fees paid to caravan parks for the keeping of private vans in parks are included in the takings of the month they are received.
- 21. Star grading refers to the grading of hotels and motels with facilities and is based on the classification system used by members of the Australian Automobile Association (AAA) and the Licensing Court of Western Australia. The gradings are allocated according to a points system based on the amenities and facilities available to guests. Details of the grading scheme are contained in the RACV-RAASA members' publication "Australian National Tourguide", or the individual tour guides produced by members of the AAA.
- 22. Employment. Details of the numbers of persons working at tourist accommodation establishments (including those working on other than accommodation activities) have not been included in this publication. However, data are available upon request from the ABS.

Related publications

23. Publications for Australia, and each State and Territory, are released by the respective offices of the ABS. Tourist accommodation statistics for past quarters are available in earlier publications commencing with the September quarter 1975. These and some unpublished statistics for certain small areas within States (e.g. local government areas or combinations of local government areas) are available upon request. From September quarter 1980 a dissection of the statistics shown in this publication, according to size of establishment, is available on request for each State (Territories excluded).
