

APPENDIX C.

TARIFFS OF THE AUSTRALASIAN COLONIES.

NOTE.—The Tariff of Tasmania having been entirely revised since the last publication of the *Victorian Year-Book* it is given in full. The Tariffs of the other colonies, having been only slightly, if at all, altered,* do not appear in the present work, but a description is given of the changes which have taken place.

The articles are arranged according to the system of classification described on page 411 *ante*, and the position of an article may be ascertained by reference to the index on pages 412 to 415 *ante*.

RECENT ALTERATIONS IN TARIFFS OF VARIOUS COLONIES.

From 17th May to 31st December, 1894.

On all goods imported into Tasmania ad valorem $3\frac{3}{4}$ per cent.

Except—

1. Goods subject to an ad valorem duty of 10 or 20 per cent.
2. Coals, and Unmanufactured Tobacco.
3. All goods mentioned and set forth in the Table of Exemptions from Duties.
