



JUNE QUARTER 1993 — KEY POINTS

TREND ESTIMATES



- The trend estimate of gross domestic product – average (GDP(A)), increased by 0.6% in June quarter 1993.
- The growth recorded in June quarter follows an increase of 0.8% in March quarter 1993.
- The trend estimate of GDP(A) has increased by 2.8% since the June quarter 1992.
- The trends of all three independent measures of GDP (I, E and P) have shown modest growth over each of the last seven quarters.
- The trend in GDP(A) per capita has increased in each of the last seven quarters, after declining for the previous two years.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- The movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) over the last three quarters are more volatile than those of the trend estimates, with consecutive percentage movements of 1.0%, 0.4% and 1.2% compared with 0.7%, 0.8% and 0.6% for the trend estimate in December 1992, March 1993 and June 1993 respectively.
- The three independent measures recorded similar movements in June quarter: GDP(I) grew by 1.2%, GDP(E) by 1.1% and GDP(P) by 1.3%.

REVISIONS THIS QUARTER

Quarterly estimates have been revised as a result of incorporating data from various annual, or less frequent, benchmark sources. There have been only small revisions to recent quarterly movements in both trend and seasonally adjusted estimates for GDP(A) at constant prices. Revisions have been somewhat greater for the independent measures particularly GDP(E). The increase in the trend estimate of GDP(A) at constant prices has been revised up marginally in March quarter 1993 from 0.6% to 0.7%.

The seasonal adjustment factors for government final consumption expenditure have been changed since the March quarter 1993 issue of this publication following a reanalysis of the series for State and Local government.

Estimates of GDP(P) have been revised for all years as a result of revised base year gross product estimates for most industries. In addition, estimates for recent quarters have been revised due to the availability of more complete survey data and the introduction of new annual benchmarks. For March quarter 1993 the movement in the trend estimate of CDP(P) has been revised up by 0.4% (\$357 million). The industries most responsible for this change are Manufacturing, Wholesale Trade, Construction and Community Services. All have had their growth rates in March quarter 1993 significantly increased.

CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

As has been the practice in the June quarter issues of 5206.0 in recent years, a number of supplementary annual tables have been included to provide annual sector income and outlay accounts and public sector capital accounts (see Tables 78 to 88).

FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure rose by 0.6%. Household durables, health and dwelling rent were the major contributors to growth.

GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Seasonally adjusted dwelling investment rose 3.5%. Nevertheless, trend growth in expenditure on dwellings (1.3%) was slower than in each of the previous four quarters.
- Business investment fell 3.0% - the result of declines of 6.3% in non-dwelling construction and of 1.5% in equipment. In seasonally adjusted terms there was a fall of 7.7% in non-dwelling construction and growth of 0.1% in equipment.

INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- A large increase in seasonally adjusted private non-farm stocks (\$505 million) contributed 0.6 percentage points to the 1.1% growth in GDP(E). Manufacturing stocks rose by \$280 million in seasonally adjusted constant price terms, the first increase in this component since March quarter 1990. Overall private non-farm stocks were built up by \$199 million in trend constant price terms.

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- A seasonally adjusted increase of 4.9% follows a fall of 3.6% in March quarter. In terms of trend estimates, exports increased by 1.2% in June quarter.

IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- In seasonally adjusted terms, imports rose by 5.5% following a fall of 2.0% in March quarter. The trend growth was 1.4% in June quarter 1993.

JUNE QUARTER 1993

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, FISHING AND HUNTING

- Declined by 0.6% despite a 0.5% increase in seasonally adjusted terms. This industry has now grown by 3.8% since June quarter 1992, largely reflecting growth in the farm sector.

MINING

- The seasonally adjusted estimate increased by 2.8%, mainly due to strong growth in oil and gas. The trend estimate increased 0.7% but has decreased 0.2% between June quarter 1992 and June quarter 1993.

MANUFACTURING

- Increased 2.1% (3.5% in seasonally adjusted terms), mainly due to increased production of *Food* and *Basic metal products*. Manufacturing has grown 6.1% since June quarter 1992.

CONSTRUCTION

- Rose 0.6% following strong growth in each of the previous three quarters, mainly due to growth in dwelling construction.

WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- In seasonally adjusted terms, both the Wholesale and Retail industries grew strongly. Trend estimates increased 1.6% and 0.6% respectively. Since June quarter 1992 Wholesale trade has grown 4.6% and Retail trade has grown 1.4%.

TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- An increase of 1.6% continued the steady pattern of growth in this industry. The main contributor is *Air transport* which has risen 14.6% since June quarter 1992.

COMMUNICATION

- Despite falling 0.3% (2.7% in seasonally adjusted terms), activity was still 5.9% higher than in June quarter 1992.


WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Fell by 0.1% (-0.7% in seasonally adjusted terms).
- The fall reflects a decrease of 0.1% in the underlying average earnings and no change in the number of wage and salary earners. The corresponding changes in seasonally adjusted terms were -2.0% in the underlying average earnings and 1.4% in the number of wage and salary earners.

GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS


- GOS of private corporate trading enterprises grew by 3.7% (4.9% in seasonally adjusted terms) to a level 10.9% higher than in June quarter 1992.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and all the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. The result is that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series - Monitoring "Trends"; An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in September quarter 1993.


Seasonally adjusted growth of 0.7% is required in September quarter 1993 to maintain the trend growth of 0.6% currently estimated for June quarter 1993.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the June quarter was 96.0%. The balance, *household saving*, was 4.0%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can be quite marked, even causing changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio, derived from trend data, from June quarter 1977 onwards (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).


HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

PRIVATE NON - FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trend current price book value terms, private non-farm stocks increased by \$500 million (0.9%) during June quarter 1993, while sales increased by \$486 million (0.8%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio increased marginally from 0.916 to 0.917. The following graph presents the ratio of trend private non-farm stocks to trend sales at current prices from June quarter 1977 onward (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).


RATIO OF PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended, at current prices rose to 0.227 in June quarter 1993 from a level of 0.223 in March quarter 1993. Trend endogenous imports rose 2.8% while trend sales rose by only 0.8%. The following graph presents this ratio from June quarter 1977 onwards.



PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE — NON-DWELLING CONSTRUC- TION AND EQUIPMENT

The June quarter 1993 estimates for equipment were largely unaffected by large one-off transactions whereas both December quarter 1992 and March quarter 1993 had significant one-off purchases (an Optus satellite and an oil-drilling platform in December quarter 1992 and an LNG tanker in March quarter 1993). In addition, there was only a relatively small impact in June quarter from purchases of second-hand assets (both non-dwelling construction and equipment) from the public sector.

Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors are provided in the table below, along with investment on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction. All estimates are shown at average 1989-90 prices.

PUBLIC GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

The trend estimate of public gross fixed capital expenditure rose by 4.0% in June quarter 1993. Public enterprise expenditure increased by 6.0% and general government increased by 1.8%. In seasonally adjusted terms the quarterly changes were 0.8% and 7.7% respectively.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS *continued*

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

The trend estimate of exports of goods and services at average 1989-90 prices rose by 1.2% in the June quarter 1993. Most commodity groups increased, with the major contributors being machinery (up 7.3%) and other mineral fuels (up 5.6%). The trend estimate for exports of services increased by 3.1%, continuing the strong increase exhibited over the previous two quarters.

The implicit price deflator (IPD) of the trend estimates of exports declined by 0.1% in June quarter 1993 while the original fixed-weighted index fell by 1.5%. Declines in the prices of wool, coal and mineral ores were the major contributors to the fall in the fixed-weighted index.

IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES


The trend estimate of imports of goods and services increased by 1.4% in June 1993, due mainly to a 3.7% increase in machinery imports, in particular ADP equipment. The trend estimate for imports of transport equipment rose by 4.2% in June quarter 1993, following three quarters of decline. The trend estimate for imports of fuel increased by 3.9%, its twelfth consecutive increase.

Prices of imported goods and services increased during June quarter with the trend implicit price deflator (IPD) increasing 0.4%.


TERMS OF TRADE

The trend terms of trade (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) declined 0.5% in June quarter 1993, reflecting the combined effects of a decrease of 0.1% in export prices and an increase of 0.4% in import prices. The seasonally adjusted terms of trade for June quarter 1993 fell by 2.3%. The following graph shows the trend terms of trade (1989-90 =100) from June quarter 1985 to June quarter 1993.



**REAL GROSS DOMESTIC
INCOME**

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Notes on the estimates* section of the March quarter 1990 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below shows trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income from June quarter 1983 onwards.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains estimates of the components of GDP and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, page 12, shows the full range of data provided.

CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

2 These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). In association with the introduction of constant price estimates at average 1989-90 prices, some of the methods used to derive constant price estimates were changed. The major changes are described in Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0).

ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

3 Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

REVISIONS

4 Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

TREND ESTIMATES

5 Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the ABS considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

6 A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters have changed.

7 If a series has a high "irregular" component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this

does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFULATOR (IPD)

9 The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates. Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT : GENERAL METHOD

10 Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here :

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I) INCOME APPROACH

11 GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

GDP(E)

EXPENDITURE APPROACH

12 GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989-90 prices.

GDP(P)

PRODUCTION APPROACH

13 GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989-90 prices) for each industry.

GDP(A)

THE AVERAGE

14 While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH

15 Tables 6 to 9 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I) and GDP(P). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100.0$$

where

A(t) = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

A(t-1) = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

GDP(t-1) = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

16 There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used :

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100.0$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 13, 14, 22, 23, 75 and 76.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

17 GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Notes on the estimates* section of the December quarter 1990 issue of this publication for a more detailed

discussion of this issue.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 75 and 76.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT OF LABOUR INPUT

18 Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

19 When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

20 A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market* sectors are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM MARKET SECTORS

21 The estimates of gross product at constant prices for two industries: Finance, property and business services; and Community services are derived using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purposes of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price gross product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be GDP(P) less the above two industries, less Public administration and defence (which is defined to be in the non-market sector, even though an estimate of productivity change is now produced for that industry), less ownership of dwellings (for

which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), plus the imputed bank service charge related to these industries.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND HOURS WORKED

22 A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector *less* Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of Agricultural production caused by changing seasonal conditions.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

23 The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

24 The ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as :

- private final consumption expenditure on goods
- plus private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment
- plus public gross fixed capital expenditure
- plus exports of non-rural goods.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

25 The ratio is endogenous imports (imports of goods excluding fuel, certain large items of equipment and certain other government imports) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76.

GDP(A) PER CAPITA

26 This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 31 and 32 and is also shown in Table 74.

DATA ON FLOPPY DISK

27 This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.

28 All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, *Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0). These data generally run from September quarter 1959. An important exception is GDP(P) and its components which run from September quarter 1974.
