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CONSUMER PRICE INDEX MARCH QUARTER, 1963

- 1. Variations in retail prices as measured by the Consumer Price Index for the six State capital cities of Australia are shown herein.
- 2. Compared with the previous quarter, the All Groups Consumer Price Index for March Quarter, 1963 increased by 0.1% for the weighted average of the six capital cities. Changes in individual cities were: Sydney +0.1%, Melbourne -0.2%, Brisbane +0.2%, Adelaide no change, Perth +0.5%, Hobart -0.2%.
- 3. Recent quarterly changes in the All Groups index have been as follows:

4. The All Groups index number for the weighted average of the six capital cities increased by 0.3% over the year ended March Quarter, 1963. Recent quarterly changes in each of the groups of this index have been as follows:-

- 5. A full description of the Consumer Price Index is contained in Labour Report No. 48, 1960.
- 6. The Consumer Price Index measures quarterly variations in prices of commodities and services as affecting a high proportion of the expenditure of wage earner households in the aggragate. Changes in the pattern of this expenditure since 1950 have been such as to render it necessary to construct the index with additional items and changes in weighting patterns at intervals (rather than on the basis of a list of items and set of weights which remain unchanged throughout the period). Four series for short periods, viz., September Quarter, 1948 to June Quarter, 1952; June Quarter, 1952 to June Quarter, 1956; June Quarter, 1956 to March Quarter, 1960; and from March Quarter, 1960 have therefore been constructed and linked to form a continuous retail price index series published herein as the Consumer Price Index. At times of linking the weighting pattern was altered and, in addition, new items that had become significant in household expenditure were introduced. In each period between links the items and weighting have remained unchanged.
- 7. The indexes measure price movements in each city individually. They do not provide a comparison of the retail price level in any city with the retail price level of any other city.
- 8. Table 1 on page 4 of this Bulletin shows Consumer Price Index numbers for each fiscal year from 1948-49 to 1961-62 and for each quarter from December Quarter, 1959. Table 2 on page 5 shows Group Index numbers quarterly from December Quarter, 1961 to March Quarter, 1963.
- 9. The following table is provided to assist interpretation of movements shown by the Consumer Price Index from December Quarter, 1962 to March Quarter, 1963.

⁽a) For each city, the total change in index points since the preceding quarter is the arithmetical difference between the All Groups Index numbers for the last two quarters shown in Table 1, page 4 hereof (e.g. Sydney: December Quarter, 1962, 123.2; March Quarter, 1963, 123.3; difference of + 0.1 index points). The dissection in this table shows the approximate amount each group has contributed to this total movement.

10. The main movements in average quarterly prices, affecting the index from December Quarter, 1962 to March Quarter, 1963, are summarized below:-

Food Group. Movements in meat and potato prices are frequently the major cause of movements in the total index. The effects of changes in prices of these items in each capital city are shown in the table in paragraph 9 on page 2 of this and preceding Bulletins. In addition this quarter prices of eggs rose in all capital cities. The food group of the index (average of six capital cities) showed a quarterly decrease of 0.2%.

Clothing and Drapery Group. The index for the weighted average of the six capital cities did not change.

Housing Group. The index for the weighted average of the six capital cities showed a quarterly increase of 0.4%.

Household Supplies and Equipment Group. The index for the weighted average of the six capital cities showed a quarterly decrease of 0.3%.

Miscellaneous Group. There were increases in prices of drivers' licences and motor car registrations in Sydney and of third party insurance in Perth. Prices of beer rose in Perth. The index for the weighted average of the six capital cities showed a quarterly increase of 0.2%.
