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## RETA IL SALES OF GOODS : AUSTRALIA <br> MONTH OF OCTOBER 9968 (PROVISIONAL)

A provisional estimate of the total value of retall sales in Australia (excluding motor vehicles, parts, petrol, etc.) for the month of October 1968 is shown in the table overleaf. Figures for some earlier months are alse shown for purposes of comparison.
2. The provisional monthly estimates of retail sales are obtalned from a sub-sample of establishments used to provide quarterly estimates of the value of retail sales. The monthly subosample is comparatively small since it is designed to provide prompt estimates of the total value of retall sales (excludiag motor vehicles, parts, petrol, ete.) without placing an undue burden on either the resources of the Bureau or upon retail establishments.
3. As the provisional monthly estimates are derived from roturns received from a sample of retail establishments, they may differ somewhat from the results which would have been obtained from a comparable complete collectinn. A measure of the likely difference is given by the standard orror of the estimates. There are about 2 chances in 3 that sample estimate will differ from results which would be obtained from a comparable complete collection by less than 1 standard error and 19 chances in 20 that the difference would be less than 2 standard errors. If, for example, a sample gives an estimate of $\$ 500 \mathrm{mllil}$ ion and the standard error of this ostimate was 1 por cent, $1, e^{\circ} \$ 5$ million, then there would be 2 chances in 3 that a comparable complete collection would give a figure within the range $\$ 495$ million to $\$ 505$ million and 19 chances in 20 that the figure would be within the range $\$ 490 \mathrm{million}$ to $\$ 510$ million.
4. The standard error of the estimates of the total value of monthly retail sales (excluding motor vehicles, parts, petrol, ete,) is about 1.0 per cent. The standard error of the month tomonth movement of the estimates of the value of retail sales is generally about 0.3 per cent of the current monthly estimate. For example, the movement in the value of retall sales between the months of September 1968 and 0ctober 1968 is shown by the original series in the table overleaf as an increase of $\$ 63.6$ million. The standard error of this movement is about 0.3 per cent of the October 1968 estimate, which is approximately $\$ 2.0$ miflion. Therefore, there would be 2 chances in 3 that the movement in retall sales between Soptember 1968 and October 1968 would be between $\$ 61.6 \mathrm{million}$ and $\$ 65.6 \mathrm{mill}$ ion and 19 chances in 29 thét it would be between $\$ 59.6$ w $1 / 1$ ion and $\$ 67.6$ m 1111 ion.

The monthly estimates may also differ from those which would be obtained from a
5atio. The montily estimates may lalse as that used to provide quarterly estimates. Hence, the sum of the estimates for the three months comprising a quarter may differ prom the estimate obtained for that quarter from the full quarterly sample. The standard error of this difference is approximately 0.8 per cent of the quarterly estimate. The monthly estimates are subsequently adjusted in acoordanee with the prellminary and final quarterly estimates as they become available.
6. Seasonally adjusted statistics are also shown in the table overleaf. In the seasonal adjustmenk, account has been taken of both normal seasonal factors and "trading-day" effects (arising from the varying numbers of Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, etc. (in the month). While the normal seasonal factors showld change only gradually from year to year, the trading-day adjustment for any month will vary from year to year in accordance with the combination of days which occur in the month. No adjustment has been made for the effects of movement in the date of Easter. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting these and other series are given in "Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1968" (Ref. Na. 1.10) issued on 21 May 1968. It should be noted that the seasonally adjusted figures reflect the sampling errors to which the original figures are subjert.
7. All figures in this bulletin are on a basis comparable with the 1961-62 Retail Census. Further information relating to the basis on which the statistios of retall sales of goods are complled is contalned in statistical bulletim "Retail Sales of Goods" (Ref. No. 11.4) June quarter 1968 of 1 November 1968.
