


JUN QTR 1998 KEY POINTS

TREND ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased by 0.7% in the June quarter to a level 4.0% higher than in June quarter 1997.
- All three independent measures of GDP increased in the June quarter, with GDP(I) up 0.7%, GDP(E) up 0.4% and GDP(P) up 0.8%.
- GDP(A) per capita increased by 0.3% in the June quarter to be 2.6% higher than in June quarter 1997.

There will be major changes to the next issue of this publication. See page 2 for further details.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased by 0.8% in the June quarter to a level 3.9% higher than in June quarter 1997.
- All three independent measures of GDP increased, with GDP(I) and GDP(E) up 0.9% and GDP(P) up 0.5%.
- The implicit price deflator for GDP recorded an increase of 0.4% to be 1.2% higher than in June quarter 1997.

REVISIONS IN THIS ISSUE

Revisions to percentage changes for major summary aggregates in trend terms are shown in Tables 41 to 43, while revisions to major summary aggregates in original terms are shown in Tables 44 to 46. Seasonal adjustment factors have been recalculated for the retail goods components of private final consumption expenditure, the alterations and additions component of gross fixed capital expenditure on private dwellings, indirect taxes less subsidies, income tax paid by households and increase in private non-farm stocks. Trend estimates for recent quarters are affected by the addition of data for June quarter 1998, as well as revisions to the original and seasonally adjusted data for earlier quarters. Original estimates for recent quarters have been revised to reflect more complete survey data.

FORTHCOMING CHANGES TO THE NATIONAL ACCOUNTS

As foreshadowed in the Information Papers *Implementation of Revised International Standards in the Australian National Accounts* (5251.0) and *Introduction of Chain Volume Measures in the Australian National Accounts* (5248.0) there will be major changes in the September quarter 1998 issue of 5206.0. As far as possible the international standards contained in the 1993 version of the *System of National Accounts* (SNA93) will be implemented, which will impact on data items, terminology and table formats. Also, the content of 5206.0 has been reviewed. In conjunction with the SNA93 changes, improved annual benchmark estimates for production account aggregates will be introduced into the national accounts. Commencing with the year 1994-95 the production account will be benchmarked to balanced annual supply-use tables.

An Information Paper entitled *Upgraded Australian National Accounts* (5253.0) will be released on 29 October 1998 to provide users with advance information about the changes to the content of 5206.0 and the impact of SNA93 changes and the improved annual benchmarking procedures on the estimates. This information paper will include a re-issue of the June quarter 1998 accounts adjusted for these changes. It is not expected that the changes will result in significant revisions to recent quarterly GDP growth rates.

FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure grew by 0.8% (1.3% seasonally adjusted). There were increases in most categories, exceptions were cigarettes and tobacco (-1.7%) and household appliances (-1.9%). Major contributors to growth were dwelling rent and other services.

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Dwelling construction grew by 3.2% (1.6% seasonally adjusted). Investment in equipment fell by 2.0% (-3.8% seasonally adjusted) while non-dwelling construction fell by 0.1% (-29.3% seasonally adjusted, which offsets the 49.1% increase in public gross fixed capital expenditure - see note on page 10).

INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- Private non-farm stocks increased by \$870 million (\$984 million seasonally adjusted) following an increase of \$704 million (\$1,263 million seasonally adjusted) in the March quarter. (See page 11 for industry details.)

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Exports of goods and services were flat in the June quarter (rose 2.2% seasonally adjusted), with goods growing by 0.1%. Rural exports fell by 4.3%, while non-rural exports grew by 0.4%.

IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Imports of goods and services increased by 1.0% in the June quarter (fell 0.6% seasonally adjusted), with goods increasing by 1.4%. Capital goods rose by 0.8%, with telecommunications equipment being the major contributor. Intermediate goods rose by 0.3%, while consumption goods increased by 2.8%.

JUNE QUARTER

SUMMARY COMMENT

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHING

- The trend estimate fell by 0.3% (down 3.8% seasonally adjusted). The latter decline is mainly due to a 3.6% decrease in livestock slaughterings and a 13% increase in seed and fodder inputs.

MANUFACTURING

- Both the trend and seasonally adjusted estimates rose by 0.7%. In seasonally adjusted terms manufacturers' sales increased by 1.8%.

CONSTRUCTION

- Rose 2.9% in trend terms but the seasonally adjusted estimate fell 3.3%. Despite this fall this industry has grown by 9.1% since the June quarter 1997 in seasonally adjusted terms, due to strong growth in December quarter 1997 and March quarter 1998.

COMMUNICATION SERVICES

- Rose 2.3% in trend terms and 0.2% in seasonally adjusted terms. Between June quarter 1997 and June quarter 1998 this industry grew strongly, up 13.4% in trend terms (up 11.6% seasonally adjusted).


WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Rose 1.2% (1.1% seasonally adjusted).
- This reflects an increase in average earnings of 0.3% and an increase in the number of wage and salary earners of 0.9%. In seasonally adjusted terms, average earnings rose 0.2%, while the number of wage and salary earners increased by 0.9%.

GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS

- In the June quarter, the GOS of private corporate trading enterprises increased by 3.3%, following an increase of 3.0% in March quarter 1998. In seasonally adjusted terms, GOS increased by 4.9% in the June quarter, following a rise of 4.2% in March quarter 1998.


WAGES SHARE OF GDP (AT FACTOR COST)(a)

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. This means that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring Trends: An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in September quarter 1998.

Seasonally adjusted growth of 0.9% is required in September quarter 1998 to maintain the trend growth, in September quarter, of 0.7% currently estimated for June quarter 1998.

It has been decided to change the way trend estimates are derived for national accounts aggregates in future issues. See the note on page 11 for details.



GROWTH RATES IN GDP(A)


The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.



HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

In trended current price terms, the proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the June quarter was 98.1%. The balance, household saving, was 1.9%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).



PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trended current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$1,431 million (1.9%) in the June quarter, while sales increased by \$910 million (1.0%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio rose from 0.861 in March quarter 1998 to 0.868. The following graph presents the ratio of private non-farm stocks to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).


Trend at Current Prices



IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended and at current prices, increased from 0.270 in March quarter 1998 to 0.276. This reflects stronger growth in imports of merchandise goods (3.4%) than in sales (1.0%). The following graph presents the ratio of imports to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 25).

Trend at Current Prices



TERMS OF TRADE

In June quarter 1998 the terms of trade index derived from trend estimates (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) fell 0.9%. The implicit price deflator for exports rose 0.9%, while the deflator for imports rose 1.8%.


Trend (1989–90 = 100)



REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the Technical Note included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989–90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below provides a comparison of trend GDP(I) at average 1989–90 prices and real gross domestic income. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 68 and 69 respectively.

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE— NON-DWELLING CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. In March quarter 1998 the publicly-owned Dampier to Bunbury natural gas pipeline was sold to the private sector for about \$2.1 billion. As a result, seasonally adjusted private gross fixed capital expenditure on non-dwelling construction increased significantly in March quarter 1998 and fell in June quarter 1998. Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors, expenditure on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction are provided in the table below.

CHANGES TO TREND ESTIMATES OF NATIONAL ACCOUNTS AGGREGATES

In the second paragraph of "Reliability of Contemporary Trend Estimates" on page 6, it is stated that approximations to the centred Henderson moving averages are used to derive trend estimates for the latest three quarters. As a result, revisions occur as more data become available.

In choosing which approximation of the Henderson moving average to use for the latest periods, there are two conflicting considerations. The first is to achieve an effective amount of smoothing and the second is to have the centre of the averages as close as possible to the reference period. The latter is important because it affects how quickly the trend estimates can detect a turning point. Inevitably, a compromise has to be struck, but the best compromise for one series need not be the best for another. For series that display a high degree of irregularity relative to trend growth the best compromise is one which has a high degree of smoothing, whilst for a series that has a low degree of irregularity relative to trend growth the best compromise is one which has less smoothing but has the centre of the average closer to the reference period. Hence, different averages are used for different series, and the choice depends on the degree of irregularity relative to trend growth a series has displayed in the past.

It has been ABS practice to derive the trend estimates of aggregates by summing the trend estimates of their components, thus maintaining the additive relationship present in the original and seasonally adjusted data. In general, aggregates tend to have a lower degree of irregularity relative to trend growth than their components, because irregularities in the components often offset each other to some extent. This implies there is a choice between having additivity on the one hand and having the best trend estimates of the aggregates on the other. The ABS has come to the view that it is best to forego additivity and to have the best trend estimates in the national accounts. Accordingly, from the September quarter 1998 issue of the national accounts the trend estimates of aggregates will be derived directly and there will be a loss of additivity for the latest three quarters.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

There was a significant increase in private non-farm stocks at constant prices in both March and June quarters 1998 with all industries contributing to the build up in both quarters. The following table shows the industry composition for the increase in private non-farm stocks in seasonally adjusted constant price terms for the last five quarters.

WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

Quarterly movements in wages, salaries and supplements can at times be significantly affected by changes in two of the component series: severance, termination and redundancy payments, and supplements to wages and salaries (i.e. employers' contributions to superannuation and workers' compensation claims). Severance, termination and redundancy payments for recent quarters are shown below (although an estimate for June quarter 1998 is not yet available separately from the total wages and salaries figure) together with estimates for supplements for the last nine quarters. (The estimates can be shown only in original terms because wages, salaries and supplements are seasonally adjusted in total.)
