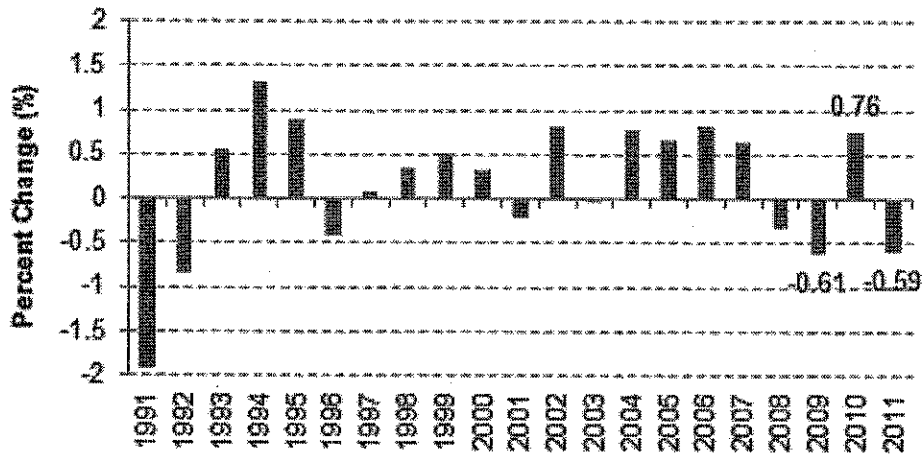

Had a quick look at this given the headlines about 2011 being the worst year for employment growth for 19 years.

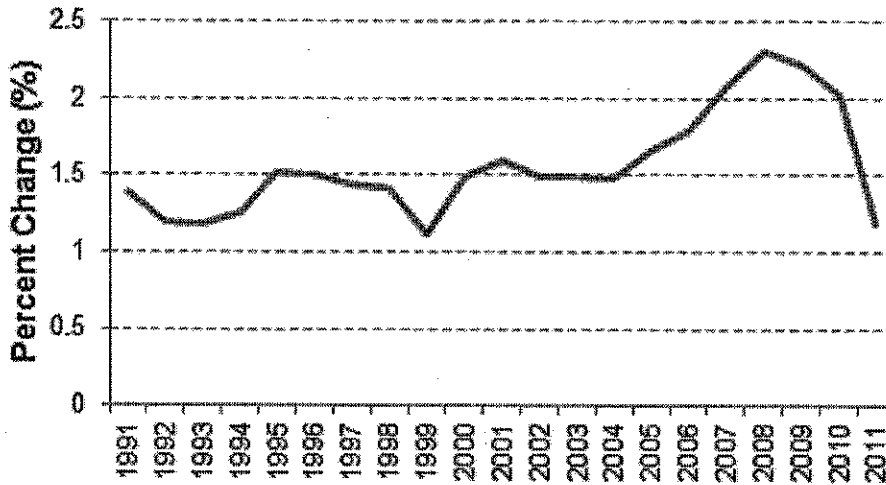
