The amounts shewn under the columns 1855 and 1856 cannot be taken as safe data for comparison as to increase and decrease in expenditure, for this reason—The column for 1855 contains expenditure of 1854 beyond £2,000,000 brought to account in 1855, and is minus that brought to account for that service during 1856 upwards of £50,000, which amount is embodied in the heads under that column; whilst the year 1856 is minus the expenditure on its account during 1857 which, on the 30th November last, exceeded £500,000 in the £50,000 yet outstanding. It is therefore suggested that a table for this purpose shall be prepared early after the close of 1857—say in the latter part of February, 1858—when the service for 1856 will be closed, and a comparison made between the actual expenditure for the respective services of 1855 and 1856, with the remarks setting forth the causes of increase or decrease. This would form reliable information, and be of use.
