DEFINITIONS.

Dwelling is defined for the purpose of the Census as a room or a collection of rooms occupied by a household group living together as a family unit, whether comprising the whole or only a part of a house or other building (including temporary structures).

Family used in the headings to the tables means a household group living together as a family unit.

Private House (Shared by Two or More Families) is a private house shared by two or more family units for which only one Householder's Schedule was received, instead of separate schedules for each portion occupied separately. Figures shown under this heading represent not "occupied dwellings" as defined for Census purposes, but "houses" occupied by more than one family.

Share of Private House is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately, and for which a separate Householder's Schedule was furnished. "Shares" are correctly described as dwellings for Census purposes.

Flat is part of a house or other building ordinarily intended for occupation by a separate family group, and is a self-contained unit with both cooking and bathing facilities.

Tenement is part of a house or other building ordinarily intended for occupation by a separate family group, but is not a self-contained unit, and consists in the main of a room or rooms with cooking facilities.

Dwellings Being Built relate to unoccupied dwellings of all types being built at 30th June, 1947, and are not identical with the number of houses under construction at the time of the Census.

The *Divisions of the State* are defined as follows:—

Metropolitan Division relates to the capital city and adjoining urban municipal areas within boundaries used for Census purposes. In 1933 and 1947 these were identical.

Urban Provincial Division comprises urban areas outside the Metropolitan Division which are separately incorporated as corporations. Some variations have been made in these areas since 1933.

Rural Division comprises the balance of the State, i.e., District Councils and the Unincorporated Areas, and is affected by the inter-censal changes in the area of the Urban Provincial Division.

In view of the foregoing, the figures for the Urban Provincial and Rural Divisions represent only a broad general classification based on administrative rather than geographical considerations.
