## APPENDIX B.

## TARIFFS OF THE AUSTRALASIAN COLONIES, IN CLASSIFIED ARRANGEMENT, INCLUDING EXCISE DUTIES, 1890.

The Tariff of Victoria is re-published in the present volume, for, although no alterations have been made since the last publication of this work, several items which have since lapsed by effluxion of time are now omitted altogether. The tariffs of the other colonies, however, having been only slightly, if at all, altered since the last publication, they do not appear in the present work, but a description is given of the changes which have taken place. All che tariffs were published in full in the Dictorian Year-Book, 1888-9.

The articles are arranged according to the system of classification described on page 71 ante; and the position of any article may be ascertained by reference to the index at pages 72 to 75 ante.
