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# LABOUR MOBILITY, AUSTRALIA, FEBRUARY 1983 (PRELIMINARY)

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# MAIN FEATURES

Note: Survey estimates are subject to sampling variability, as explained in paragraph 16 below.

Of the 7,220,900 persons who worked at some time during the year ending February 1983, 88.6 per cent (6,396,200) had only one employer or business during the year and 8.9 per cent (639,900) had two employers or businesses during the year.

At February 1983, of the 6,342,000 persons who had jobs, 14.4 per cent (911,000) had changed jobs during the previous year, 6.1 per cent (387,500) had had no previous job during the year and 79.5 per cent (5,043,400) had been in their current job for one year or more.

Of the 3,982,200 males who had a job at February 1983, 18.8 per cent (748,100) had held their current job for less than a year. For females this proportion was 23.3 per cent. In February 1982 the proportions were 23.0 per cent for males and 28.0 per cent for females.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### Introduction

In association with the February 1983 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia, persons aged fifteen years and over who had been employed at some time during the year up to the end of the week prior to interview in February 1983 were asked about their labour mobility during the period. Specific questions related to the duration of current job, whether respondents had changed jobs or not and the number of jobs held during the period.

- 2. During the two weeks beginning Monday 7 February, 1983, specially trained interviewers asked the questions of a sub-sample of 51,000 of the 71,000 respondents in the February labour force survey.
- 3. Results of similar surveys, the first conducted in November 1972, have been published in *Labour Mobility*, *Australia* (6209.0).

4. This publication contains only a summary of the results of the survey. Estimates shown are preliminary and may be revised. Further information which will be published as soon as possible is available on request.

#### Scope

- 5. The survey includes all civilians aged fifteen years and over except:
  - (a) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
  - (b) overseas residents in Australia;
  - (c) dependants of non-Australian defence forces personnel stationed in Australia;
  - (d) students boarding at school, some patients in hospitals and sanatoria and inmates of jails, reformatories etc.
- 6. The estimates relate to persons covered by the survey in February 1983. Because of emigration, deaths and other exits not all persons with labour force experience during the period were covered. Labour mobility may relate to experience outside Australia.

#### **Definitions**

- 7. It is impractical to obtain information relating to a whole year which is strictly comparable with that obtained in the monthly labour force survey for which the reference period is one week. The definitions used in determining the labour force status of persons in the monthly survey depend on a detailed set of questions asked about a person's labour force activity during the reference period. For the survey of labour mobility a person is assigned to a labour force category for each of the weeks in the year on the basis of a more limited set of questions. It is for this reason that the terms worked and looked for work are used in this survey rather than the rigidly defined terms employed and unemployed used in the monthly labour force survey.
- 8. The *labour force* comprises all persons who, during any week, are working or looking for work as defined in paragraphs 9 and 10.

- 9. Persons are classified as working for those weeks they reported having either worked or being on paid leave. Periods of one week or more on strike or time off without pay are excluded.
- 10. Persons are classified as *looking for work* for those weeks they reported as being out of work and looking for a job.
- 11. Persons out of the labour force are those who, during any week, are neither working nor looking for work as defined in paragraphs 9 and 10.
- 12. For the purposes of the survey, a job is defined as:
  - (a) employment as a wage or salary earner (or unpaid family helper) by a particular employer, in a particular locality; or
  - (b) self-employment (with or without employees) in a particular locality.
- 13. Locality. In capital cities and major towns each suburb is considered to be a different locality.
- 14. A change of job may involve a change of employer without a change of job location; a change of location without a change of employer; or a change in both employer and location. For example, the movement of an employer's operations to premises in a different location would entail a change of job for employees who moved to the new location. Promotion or transfer of an employee which involves a move to premises in a different location would also constitute a change of job. It should be noted, however, that for a person who works at different sites for the same employer (for example, a construction worker), his base of operations (i.e. his employer's office, depot, yard, etc.) is considered to be his place of work.

## Discontinuity in the series

15. The estimates in this publication are not strictly comparable with those obtained from previous surveys. The reference period for the February 1980 and prior surveys was the previous calendar year (e.g. 1 January to 31 December 1979). The reference period for the February 1981 and 1982 surveys was from the beginning of the previous February to the end of the week prior to interview. As interviews were conducted over the second and third week of February, the reference period could extend to 54 weeks. For the February 1983 survey the reference period is the 52 weeks up to the end of the week prior to interview. Due to the change in the reference period timing, some estimates, particularly those for groups who enter the labour force during the earlier months of the year (e.g. 15 to 19 year olds) will also be affected from February 1981 survey onwards.

#### Reliability of the estimates

- 16. Estimates in this publication are subject to two sources of error:
  - (a) sampling error: since the estimates are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings they are subject to sampling variability; that is they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings

had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the *standard error*. More information about this topic will be found in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0). A table of estimated standard errors for this survey follows these notes. Estimates with a standard error of more than about 25 per cent have not been shown in this publication, as the degree of sampling variability would seriously detract from their value for most reasonable uses. Although figures for these small components can, in some cases, be derived by subtraction they should not be regarded as reliable.

(b) non-sampling error: inaccuracies may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents and errors made in the coding and processing of data. These inaccuracies may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
