EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

In February 1976 a survey, based on the quarterly population survey, was conducted throughout Australia in order to obtain information about changes of employment or job location and other aspects of labour mobility.

2. A preliminary statement containing a summary of the more important results was published on 30 June 1976 (Reference No. 6.34). Data for earlier periods have been published in the November 1972 and February 1975 issues of *Labour Mobility* (Reference No. 6.43).

The population survey

3. The survey is based on a multi-stage area sample of private dwellings (about 30,000 houses, flats, etc.) and non-private dwellings (hotels, motels, etc.), and covers about two-thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia. The information is obtained each quarter from the occupants of selected dwellings by carefully chosen and specially trained interviewers. The interviews are carried out during a period of four weeks, so that there are four survey weeks in each of the months to which the survey relates. These four survey weeks are chosen so as to fall within the limits of the calendar month or with minimum encroachment into the adjacent months.

Scope

4. The estimates relate to all persons aged 15 years and over, except persons in institutions, members of the permanent armed forces and certain diplomatic personnel customarily excluded from census and estimated populations. Persons in institutions are those who were patients in hospitals and sanatoria, or inmates of gaols, reformatories, etc., and for whom, for the purpose of the survey, the institution was regarded as their dwelling.

Definitions

5. Definitions of labour force categories used in this bulletin are the same as those used in the quarterly labour force survey, which are set out in the bulletin *The Labour Force* (Reference No. 6.20).

6. For the purposes of the survey, a *job* was defined as :

- (i) employment as a wage or salary earner (or unpaid family helper) by a particular employer, in a particular locality; or
- (ii) self-employment (with or without employees) in a particular locality.

Thus, a change of job may have involved a change of employer without a change of job locality; a change of locality without a change of employer; or a change in both employer and locality. For example, the movement of an employer's operations to premises in a different locality would entail a change of job for employees who moved to the new location. Promotion or transfer of an employee which involved a move to premises in a different locality would also constitute a change of job. In capital cities and major towns, each suburb was considered to be a different locality; otherwise, each town and each country area associated with a town constituted a separate locality. It should be noted, however, that for a person who worked at different sites for the same employer (for example, a construction worker), his base of operations (i.e. his employer's office, depot, yard, etc.) was considered to be his place of work.

7. For the purposes of this survey :

- (a) *Industry* was classified according to the Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC). A change of industry was defined as a change from one division to another.
- (b) *Occupation* was classified according to the 1971 Population Census Classification of Occupations. A change of occupation was defined as a change from one major group to another major group.

Reliability of the estimates

8. Since the estimates in this statement are based on a sample, they may differ from the figures that would have been obtained from a complete census using the same questionnaires and procedures. More information on this topic is given in the Technical Note, Page 38.

9. The estimates are also subject to errors of response and reporting. There has been a tendency for respondents to give only approximate answers to the question on duration of job. Consequently the distribution of estimates shows some clustering, particularly around the 10 year level. For this reason the estimates should be used with caution.

10. The method used in classifying persons according to occupation in the population census takes educational qualifications into account, whereas in the population survey this is not generally the case. For this reason the estimates for the occupation group "Professional, technical and related workers" may be overstated.

11. Analysis of the estimates has shown that a number of respondents were reported as having worked

for the same employer at a particular locality for one or more years but had been employed for considerably less than the full year during 1975. Although there are valid reasons why this can be so (e.g. unpaid maternity leave, unpaid sick leave, extended periods of stand-down without pay, etc. during 1975), it is probable that some respondents misinterpreted the job tenure question (e.g. persons employed for a short time regularly each year by the same employer may have been reported as having worked for that employer for more than one year). In this regard, it should be noted that about 36,000 males, 46,400 married women and 8,200 other females worked less than 40 weeks in 1975 but claimed they worked for the same employer at a particular location for one year or more. For this reason estimates in this bulletin concerning duration of job held at the end of 1975 should be used with caution.

TECHNICAL NOTE

Estimation procedure

The estimates are derived from the quarterly population survey by use of a complex ratio estimation procedure, which ensures that the survey estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population by age and sex, rather than to the age and sex distribution within the sample itself.

Reliability of the estimates

2. Since the estimates in this bulletin are based on a sample they may differ from the figures that would have been obtained from a complete census using the same questionnaires and procedures. One measure of the likely difference is given by the *standard error*, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample, and not the whole population, was enumerated. There are about two changes in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained from a comparable complete enumeration, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors.

3. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this bulletin. A table of *standard errors* for general application is given below. These figures will not give a precise measure of standard error of a particular estimate since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of quarterly labour force surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics. However, they will provide an indication of the magnitude of the standard error of any particular estimate. An example of the use of the table is as follows: if the estimate for Australia obtained from the sample is 100,000 the standard error is 3 per cent of the estimate i.e. 3,000: there are then about two

chances in three that the true figure is within the range 97,000 to 103,000 and about nineteen chances in twenty that this figure is between 94,000 and 106,000.

4. The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends upon both the size of the numerator and the size of the denominator. However, the per cent standard error of the estimated percentage will generally be lower than the per cent standard error of the estimate of the numerator. The per cent standard errors of the numerators can be obtained from the table below.

5. As the standard errors in the table below show, *the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error*. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In the tables in this bulletin, estimates less than the lowest levels shown in the table below have not been published. Although figures for these small components can in some cases be derived by subtraction, they should not be regarded as reliable.

6. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the *non-sampling error*, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or only a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
