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#### MAIN FEATURES

Note: Survey estimates are subject to sampling variability, as explained in paragraph 13 below.

In March 1983, an estimated 706,300 persons who were neither employed nor unemployed wanted a jo b. represents an increase of 56,500 over the corresponding figure in September 1982.

Of the 706,300 who wanted a job, 491,900 were available to start work in the following four weeks. 273,100 were because of looking for work not personal considerations and 239,200 because of family considerations.

113,200 persons were discouraged jobseekers, an increase of 35,800 (46 per cent) since March 1982 and 28,700 (34 per cent) since September 1982. 96,000 discouraged jobseekers were female.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTES

# Introduction

In association with the March 1983 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia, persons aged fifteen to sixty-four years who were not in the labour force were asked about their labour force aspirations

and, if appropriate, their availability for work and reasons for not currently seeking employment.

- During the two weeks beginning Monday 7 March, 1983, carefully chosen specially trained interviewers asked questions of those of the 73,000 respondents in the March labour force survey who fell within the scope of this survey.
- This publication contains only a summary of the results of the survey. Estimates shown are preliminary and may be revised. Further information which will be published as soon as possible is available on request. Results of similar surveys, the first conducted in November 1975 have been published in Persons Not in the Labour Force, Australia (6220.0).

## Scope

- The survey includes all persons not in the labour force aged fifteen to sixty-four years except:
  - (a) certain diplomatic personnel of governments. overseas excluded from customarily and estimated census populations;
  - (b) overseas visitors holidaying in Australia;

- (c) dependants of non-Australian
   defence forces personnel
   stationed in Australia;
- (d) persons who had actively looked for work but were unable to start a job in survey week for reasons other than their own temporary illness or injury;
- (e) persons who have a job but, up to the end of survey week, have been away from work without pay for four weeks or longer; and
- (f) persons permanently unable to work, students boarding at school, some patients in hospitals and sanatoria and inmates of reformatories, jails, etc.

Table 1 illustrates the group within the civilian population aged fifteen years and over who are covered by this survey.

#### Definitions

- Definitions of the principal labour force and demographic categories appearing in this publication are given in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0).
- 6. <u>Persons who want a job</u> are those who:
  - (a) in the four weeks before the interview week had not looked for work but in the survey answer 'yes' or 'maybe' to the question 'Even though you have not been looking for work would you like a full-time or part-time job now?', or
  - (b) although claiming to have looked for work in the four weeks before the interview week, had not taken active steps to find work.
- 7. Active steps to find work include writing, telephoning or applying in person to an employer for work; answering a newspaper advertisement for a job; checking

- factory or Commonwealth Employment Service noticeboards; being registered with the Commonwealth Employment Service; checking or registering with any other employment agency, advertising or tendering for work; and contacting friends or relatives.
- 8. <u>Highest ranked reason.</u> Reasons for not actively looking for work have been ranked in the order of priority snown in Table 4; where more than one reason was given, only the highest ranked has been included in the estimates.
- Among the reasons for not personal work looking for considerations include: own ill health, physical disability or pregnancy; studying or returning to studies; and to work: family necessity considerations include such matters as ill health of another person; inability to find child care; children thought to be too young; a preference for looking after children and disapproval by the person's spouse.
- 10. <u>Discouraged</u>. Comprises persons who want a job but have not taken active steps to look for work because they believe they would not be able to find a job for any of the following reasons: considered by employers to be too young or too old; language or racial difficulties; lack the necessary training, skills or experience; no jobs in their locality or line of work.

#### Discontinuities in the series

- Estimates for March 1979 and earlier periods are not strictly comparable with those obtained from later surveys because, commencing with survey, 1979 September definition of Persons who want a job was widened to include those persons referred to in paragraph 6(b), some of be classified as would whom Discouraged.
- This survey excludes persons who have a job but, up to the end of survey week, have been away from work without pay for four weeks or longer (see paragraph 4 (e)). With the exception of the September 1980 survey when these persons were also excluded,

surveys of Persons Not in the Labour Force prior to March 1982 <u>included</u> such persons and asked them appropriate questions.

# Reliability of the estimates

- 13. Estimates in this publication are subject to two sources of error:
  - sampling error: since the estimates are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings they are subject to sampling variability; that is they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the error. standard More information about this topic will be found in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0). A table of estimated standard errors for this survey follows these notes. Estimates with a standard error of more than about 27 per cent have not been shown in this publication, as degree of sampling variability would seriously detract from their value for most reasonable uses. Although figures for these components can, in some cases, be derived by subtraction they should not be regarded as reliable.
  - (b) non-sampling error:
    inaccuracies may occur because
    of imperfections in reporting
    by interviewers and respondents
    and errors made in the coding
    and processing of data. These
    inaccuracies may occur in any

enumeration, whether it be a full count or only a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
