AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY BUSINESS INDICATORS, DECEMBER 1993

MAIN FEATURES

The December issue of ACT Business Indicators sees the addition of a new trend series indicator for State Accounts data.

In the December issue of ACT Business Indicators notable increases have occurred in the following series:

- Trend series State final demand increased in the September quarter 1993 over the same period last year by 2.2 per cent.
- The value of residential alterations and additions in October 1993 increased by 13.2 per cent to \$6 million over September 1993.
- Trend series for October for total retail turnover increased by 0.4 per cent from September 1993 and by 5.6 per cent from the same period last year.
- Room occupancy rates in the ACT increased by 7.2 percentage points in the September quarter of 1993 from the June quarter 1993 and by 13.9 percentage points over the same period in 1992.
- Trend series unemployment rate for November 1993 remained steady at 7.7 per cent.

Several series experienced falls in the latest figures.

Trend figures for new motor vehicle registrations in the ACT decreased 2 per cent in the month of November 1993 from the previous month. However, there was a 14 per cent increase over the same period last year.

Value of total building approvals for the ACT decreased by 8.2 per cent from the previous month compared with a national decrease of 18.4 per cent over the same period.

Total new housing commitments in the ACT fell by 13.8 per cent from September 1993 compared to a national decrease of 10.1 per cent for the same period.

Trend series private final consumption expenditure for the September quarter 1993 increased over the June quarter 1993 by 4.8 per cent compared with 1 per cent increase for Australia over the same period. The annual increase was 2.5 per cent, which compares to the national increase of 3 per cent.

The number of employed persons for the ACT in November rose by 0.2 per cent to 160 800 in original terms, compared with the Australian increase of 0.1 per cent.

The trend series participation rate in the ACT for November 1993 increased by 0.1 percentage point to 74.4 per cent. The national increase was also 0.2 of a percentage point taking the rate to 63.1 per cent.


Original new motor vehicle registrations for the ACT grew by 4.3 per cent to 1 015 from October 1993. This also represents an increase of 10.8 per cent over the year since November 1992. However, this figure trails the national increase of 12.1 per cent between October and November 1993 and 12.5 per cent between November 1992 and November 1993.











MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS




TURNOVER OF RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS




BUILDING APPROVALS
