# ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES MARCH 1994

NOTE: From this issue, original labour force estimates are based on population estimates obtained from the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. Small revisions have therefore been made to many of the estimates from January 1989 to January 1994. Seasonally adjusted and trend labour force estimates have also been revised as a result of the revisions to original estimates and the annual reanalysis of seasonal factors.

### **MAIN FEATURES**

### **Employment**

Seasonally adjusted, the number of employed persons in NSW in February 1994 increased by 4,000 or 0.2% from January 1994. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of employed persons increased by 14,400 or 0.2%.

### Unemployment

The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW in February 1994 was 292,600, a decrease of 9,700 or 3.2% from the previous month. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons declined by nearly 3.6%. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for NSW fell from 10.4% in January 1994 to 10.0% in February, while the national rate remained at 10.5%.

### Average Weekly Earnings

In November 1993 the average weekly earnings (trend series) for all employees in NSW was \$539.40. This was a decrease of 0.5% since August 1993, but an increase of 1.2% in the twelve months since November 1992. Nationally, the figure was \$522.30 per week, an increase of 0.1% since August 1993 and an increase of 3.0% on the previous year.

#### Tourism

There were significant increases in tourist accommodation room occupancy rates and takings for accommodation between the December 1992 and December 1993 quarters. The room occupancy rate for NSW rose from 50.7% to 55.1%, with Sydney Statistical Division recording an 8.6 percentage point increase to 63.4%. Takings from accommodation increased by 9.4% from \$222.7m to \$243.6m.

### Retail Turnover

The trend estimates of retail turnover for NSW in January 1994 increased by 1.0% on the previous month. The national increase in January was 0.5%.

## New Motor Vehicle Registrations

The seasonally adjusted number of new motor vehicle registrations in NSW in February 1994 (18,040) increased by 7.0% compared to January 1994. There was an increase of 3.5% for Australia over the same period.

#### NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.






## GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT, AUSTRALIA SEASONALLY ADJUSTED (Average 1989–90 prices, quarterly)






## MONTHLY CHANGE IN NUMBER OF PERSONS EMPLOYED




## PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)




## NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)




## VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS COMMENCED (Average 1989-90 prices, quarterly)




## UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)




### RETAIL TURNOVER (Trend, monthly)
