# ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES MAY 1997

**EMPLOYMENT** 

The seasonally adjusted number of employed persons in NSW was 2,826,200 in April 1997, an increase of 0.5% on the previous month.

Nationally, employment rose by 0.4% over the same period.

UNEMPLOYMENT

The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW was 248,200 in April 1997, a rise of 3.1% on the previous month, but a fall of 1.0% on April 1996. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in April 1997 was 8.1% in NSW and 8.7% nationally.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS

In seasonally adjusted terms, new motor vehicle registrations in NSW increased by 1.8% from 20,232 in February 1997 to 20,602 in March 1997.

BUILDING APPROVALS

The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW in March 1997 was 4,191, a rise of 2.8% on the previous month and 25.2% on March 1996.

**FINANCE** 

The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW in March 1997 increased by 12.1% from February 1997 and 13.9% from March 1996.

## **NOTES**

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.





#### BALANCE ON GOODS AND SERVICES, AUSTRALIA SEASONALLY ADJUSTED (Monthly)





#### GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT. AUSTRALIA SEASONALLY ADJUSTED




