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ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES JUNE 1994

MAIN FEATURES

Employment

Seasonally adjusted, the estimated number of employed people in NSW in May 1994 increased by 6,000 (0.2%) from April 1994. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of employed persons increased by 30,500 or 0.4% between April 1994 and May 1994.

Unemployment

The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW in May 1994 was 283,100, down 8,100 (2.8%) from the previous month and 19,600 (6.5%) from May 1993. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for NSW fell from 10.0% in April 1994 to 9.7% in May 1994, while the national rate decreased from 10.1% to 9.8%.

New Motor Vehicle Registrations

The seasonally adjusted number of new motor vehicle registrations in NSW in May 1994 (18,031) increased by 19.8% compared to May 1993. There was an increase of 14.7% for Australia over the same period.

Building Commencements

The number of new dwelling units commenced in NSW in March quarter 1994 (10,564) decreased by 8.7% compared to December quarter 1993 (11,565), but increased by 1.3% compared with March quarter 1993 (10,429).

Housing Finance for Owner Occupation

The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW fell by 22.3% in April 1994 compared to March 1994, but was 36.2% higher than in April 1993.

Actual New Fixed Capital Expenditure

Although the value of new fixed capital expenditure in NSW increased by 11% for the December quarter 1993 compared to the September quarter 1993, it is 19.7% lower than the value for the December quarter 1993.

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

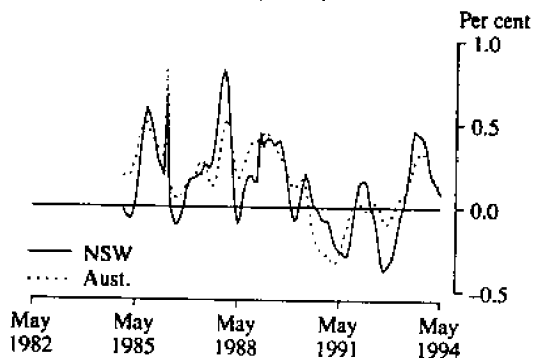

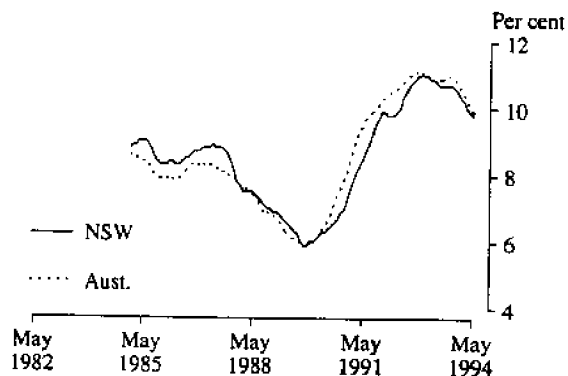

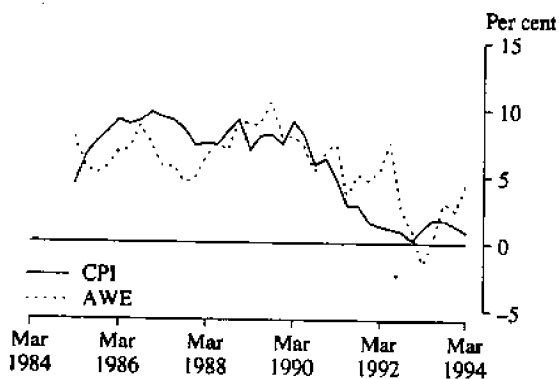
MONTHLY CHANGE IN NUMBER OF PERSONS EMPLOYED (Trend)



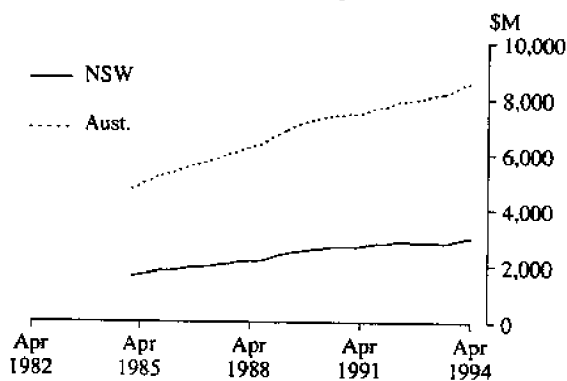
UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)



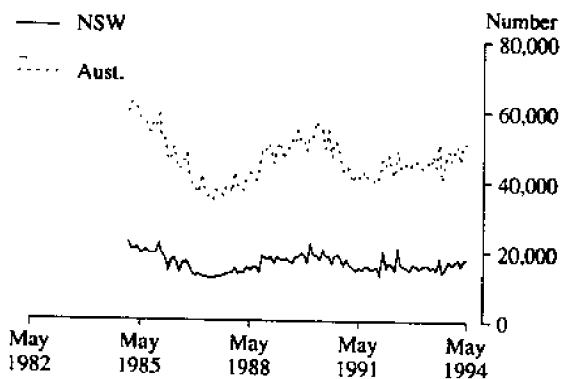
PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)



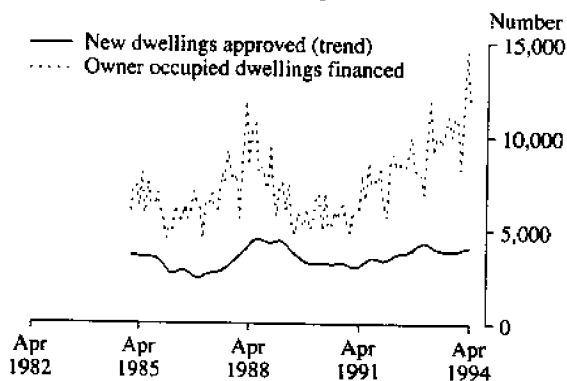
RETAIL TURNOVER (Trend, monthly)



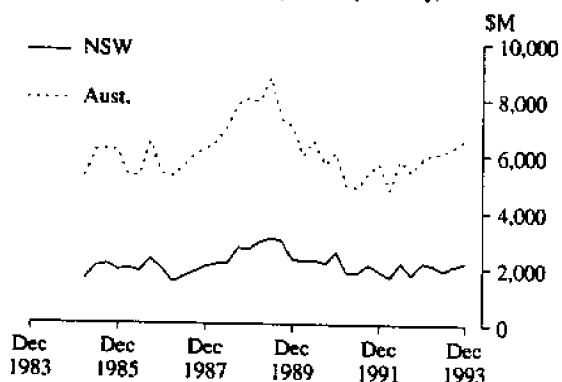
NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)



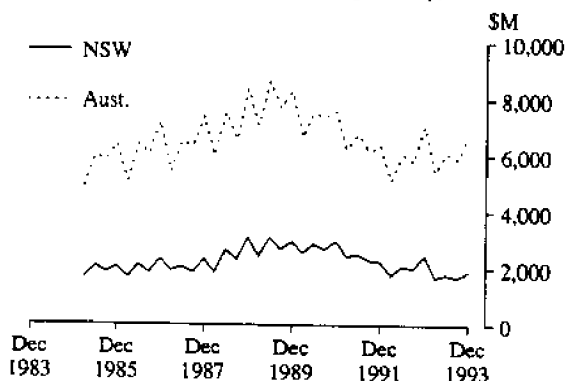
NEW DWELLINGS AND LOANS APPROVED, NSW (Monthly)
