# ECONOMIC INDICATORS, QUEENSLAND, DECEMBER 1994

#### MAIN FEATURES

- Over the 3 years ending September 1994, Australia's GDP(A) recorded consistent growth. In trend estimate terms GDP(A) increased 1.2% from June quarter 1994 to September quarter 1994 and increased 5.8% from September quarter 1993 to September quarter 1994. From September quarter 1993 to September quarter 1994, gross fixed capital expenditure increased 18.1%, imports of goods and services increased 9.5% and exports of goods and services increased 2.8%.
- During November 1994, the Australian dollar appreciated 4.5% against the trade-weighted index of the currencies of Australia's major trading partners, 5.1% against the Japanese yen and 3.4% against the \$US. The provisional trend estimate for the October current account deficit was \$1,850m, down \$28m or 1.5% from the provisional trend estimate for September 1994.
- The Australian index of manufacturing production showed growth over the year ending September quarter 1994 with the total manufacturing index increasing 12.3%. All components of the manufacturing index increased over the same period with food, beverages and tobacco increasing 11.2% and transport equipment increasing 19.6%.
- The provisional trend estimate of Australian company profits before income tax, increased 6.2% during September quarter 1994 and 34.6% from

- September quarter 1993 to September quarter 1994. The trend estimate has consistently increased since June 1991 and in September quarter 1994 at \$6,554m was at its highest level since the series commenced in 1985. From September quarter 1993 to September quarter 1994 the annual consumer price index increase for Australia was 1.9% and 2.4% for Queensland.
- Queensland's trend estimate unemployment rate remained steady at 9.1% for the four consecutive months ending November 1994. However, total persons employed in trend estimate terms increased 4,700 from October 1994 reaching 1,461,000 in November 1994. The participation rate for Queensland in trend estimate terms continued to grow for five consecutive months reaching 64.3% in November 1994.
- The value of all building approved in Queensland increased 4.7% to \$593.2m from September 1994 to October 1994. However, the trend estimate of total dwelling units approved decreased 2.4% to 4,426 dwelling units for the same period. The provisional trend estimate for total new motor vehicle registrations in Queensland fell for the fifth consecutive month in October 1994 to 9,475. The provisional trend estimate for Queensland retail sales continued to increase and was 10% higher in October 1994 than in October 1993.

Statistics shown in this publication are the latest available at the date of preparation. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues. Reference should therefore always be made to the latest issue, or to the statistical publication on the specific subject when figures are not shown.
