On the 30th September, 1885, the estimated population of Victoria was 981,465, viz., 522,671 males and 458,794 females.

On the 30th June, 1885, the estimated population of New South Wales was 947,986, viz., 527,917 males and 420,069 females. ² On the 1st October, 1885, the estimated total population of South Australia was 320,451.

Public instruction is free in Victoria, Queensland, and New Zealand; but fees are charged in the other colonies, although they are partially or entirely remitted in cases where the parents are unable to pay them. The prescribed school age differs in the various colonies; in Victoria it is from 6 to 15 years, in New South Wales from 6 to 14, in Queensland from 6 to 12, in South Australia from 7 to 13, in Tasmania from 7 to 14, and in New Zealand from 7 to 13 years. For a complete account of the educational systems of the various colonies, see *Victorian Year-Book* 1880-81, pp. 431 to 459.
